Case 5: The Case of the "Star-Cross'd Lovers"
For Case 5 we are taking a few poetic liberties with our title. If you recall your high school Shakespeare, perhaps you will recall the Prologue to "Romeo and Juliet", in which Shakespeare refers to "A pair of star-cross'd lovers" and ends it with "The which if you with patient ears attend, What here shall miss, our toil shall strive to mend". Case 5 will not bring up the mysteries of love potions; however, it most definitely will bring up a few mysteries surrounding a pair of stars and crosses on a famous set of sport stamps.

I would imagine that almost all collectors of sports stamps are acquainted with the two sets of stamps which Uruguay issued in 1924 and 1928 to celebrate the soccer victories in the Olympic Games of those years. I wonder how many know that the second set (1928) was also issued for official use. Unfortunately, "Scott" has only this note at the end of its listing of Uruguay officials:
"Since 1928, instead of official stamps, Uruguay has used envelopes with "S.0." printed on them and stamps of many issued which are punched with various designs such as star or crescent".

It is also unfortunate that many collectors probably do not possess a "Landmans" which illustrates these punches. The first type is a five-pointed star. The second is commonly referred to as a Maltese cross, although technically it probably resembles a pattee cross more than a Maltese cross.
"Landmans" indicates that Type II (the Maltese cross) is slightly more valuable than

Type I (the star). Of Type II, the two centavo and the eight centavo are the scarcer values; of Type I, the five centavo is the scarcest of the three.

Since these stamps were for official use, any unused copies are of the "back door" variety. Multiples exist, as do copies with double punches.

The mysteries I would like cleared up are these:

1. Why were both the star and the cross used on the same set? Who had charge or control of the punching and is there any particular significance to the star or the cross? As a guess I would assume that the punches were applied at various times, depending on the supply available.
2. Can anyone supply an estimate of the quantities punched? These stamps are not easy to locate and are usually found at the end of a dealer's stock book or counter book of Uruguayan stamps. It is quite difficult to put together a complete set of both the star and the cross piercings. The centering on this soccer set is notoriously bad anyway; if you manage to locate copies with the punches, take them. Don't worry about the centering. There is no floating supply of these.
3. When were these stamps first putinto use and when was their use discontinued? The only legible dates on my copies are 1930 (June and October). Undoubtedly they had a much longer life span than that.
4. Where and how were these stamps used? Again, the only legible copies I have show Montevideo as the place. Across the top of each cancellation reads "Oficial Y Prensa". I have not seen entire covers, although they must exist.

I am sure that some of our SPI members, especially those in South America, can help solve the mystery of the "star-cross'd" lovers. And to paraphrase Shakespeare, "What here I did miss, your toil shall strive to mend".

## PHILATELIC MARKET REPORT

## - Fred Farr -

This month's column continues the comparison between retail prices in the United States and those prices prevailing in England and France. The fact that retail prices of sports stamps in the United States are considerably below prices prevailing elsewhere in the world is a clear indication that American dealers have the world's only large stocks of sports stamps. Once those stocks are dispersed, however, American prices will have to climb sharply to equal prices charged elsewhere in the world. Already many American dealers are buying up sports stamps and sending them to Europe, where they bring several times the price paid by American collectors. The handwriting is on the wall for all who wish to read!

Tip of the month--Hungary 1160-67. Here is a set with everything the sports philatelist could want: handsome large-sized pictorials, attractive colors, each stamp depicts athletes, one stamp depicts soccer (world's most important sport), and it's an 0lympiana set, issued to honor the 16th Olympiad, held in Melbourne in 1956. Tipped in this column in March, 1964, this set retails at $60 \%$, which is also the price charged by American wholesalers. In London, however, the retail price is $\$ 2.80$ and Parisian dealers charge $\$ 2.70$. When a set sells in Europe for more than four times its American price, isn't it time that this item was in your collection? Certainly it will never be cheaper than its current American retail price.

Souvenir sheets of Dominican Republic. Although many collectors are enchanted with souvenir sheets, we must remember that they really fulfill no postal requirements, even though they are usually available on covers and first-day covers for those who want them in that condition. However, the astute philatelist will soon find out that there is a tremendous disparity in the prices charged for souvenir sheets here as compared with the prices charged elsewhere in the world. The souvenir sheets of the Dominican Republic are
perfect examples of this and we must remember that they will be listed in next year's "Stanley Gibbons" catalogue, thereby increasing collector demand.

Souvenir sheets of Dominican Republic 474-78 and C97-9. Issued in 1957 to honor Winners of the 01ympic Games gold medal, there were 25,000 sheets issued, both perforate and imperforate. American retailers charge $\$ 7.00$ for the two sheets, but London dealers ask $\$ 24.50$ and Parisian dealers get $\$ 29.00$. I will not quote American wholesale prices for these (and other) Dominican Republic sheets because I am not sure that the wholesalers can actually supply them.

Souvenir sheets of Dominican Republic 479-83 and Cl00-02. These sheets honored the non-Communist winners of gold medals at the 16 th Olympiad, held at Melbourne. Some l2,500 sheets were issued, both perforate and imperforate, which is just one-half the quantity of the first issued (mentioned above). American retailers charge $\$ 9.00$ for the two sheets, but London dealers ask $\$ 21.00$ and French dealers get $\$ 29.00$.

Souvenir sheets of Dominican Republic 484-88 and Cl03-15. Still more non-Communist winners of the l6th Olympiad are honored on these stamps, issued in an edition of 25,000 sheets, both perforate and imperforate. Available for $\$ 5.50$ from American retailers, these sheets cost $\$ 12.60$ in London, although French dealers get $\$ 18.50$ for them.

Souvenir sheets of Dominican Republic 501-05 and Cl06-08. This was the third (and last) issue which honored the non-Communist winners of the 16th Olympiad. Presumably the collectors were getting tired of these issues, so only 12,500 sets of sheets were printed (one-half the previous quantity). Issued in 1958, the new issue price was approximately $\$ 2.00$, but American retailers now charge $\$ 3.50$ for the se sheets. Prices in Europe are not much higher; London dealers get $\$ 4.20$ and French dealers ask $\$ 5.70$. Of the four issues mentioned here, this pair of sheets is undoubtedly the best buy if you can get them at the $\$ 3.50$ price charged by many American retailers.

Hungary 1057-61 and Cl23-27. Issued in 1953 to commemorate the opening of the new People's Stadium in Budapest, this set is desirable for several reasons: printed in handsome multi-colors, diamond shapes, includes airmail denominations, and one value depicts soccer. In addition there are many dedicated collectors of Hungarian stamps, both in Hungary and elsewhere, as well as collectors of European stamps, all of whom will need this set. Tipped in March of 1964, I find that the American retail price is still \$1.75, although the wholesale price in New York has increased from $\$ 1.30$ in 1964 to $\$ 3.50$ today. Dealers in London get $\$ 3.90$ for this set, but $\$ 4.80$ is charged by French dealers. These facts should help to make you realize how under-valued this set is on the American retail market.

Hungary Cl58-65. Of all the issues mentioned in this month's column, this set is the most attractive of the lot. Issued in 1955, presumably for no special reason other than to part collectors from their cash, these stamps depict winter sports, such as ice skating, skiing, sledding, ice hockey, and ice yachting. Tipped in March of 1964, the retail price has increased from $\$ 1.50$ to $\$ 2.00$, although American wholesalers get $\$ 2.55$ for their sets. Dealers in London and Paris both charge $\$ 4.00$, which is exactly twice the current American retail price.

Paraguay 556-52 and c262-64. Soccer aficionados dote on this set, of which only 50,000 complete sets were issued in 1960 to honor the $17 \mathrm{th} 01 y m p i a d$ in Rome. Although is-

sued by a country which is a first-class philatelic prostitute, this set will always be in demand; it's an Olympiana item, it includes airmail denominations, and it depicts soccer, the world's most popular sport. No doubt you remember that I tipped this set in March of 1966; it is still available at $50 \notin$ retail and $80 \phi$ wholesale in the United States--note that the wholesale price is sixty per cent higher than the retail price! In Paris the price is $\$ 2.00$, but dealers in London get $\$ 2.50$ for their sets. Here's your chance to buy stamps at less than wholesale and at only twenty per cent of the price prevailing in London (which is still the world's largest philatelic market). Could you ask for anything more?

Persia 1133. Here is an ugly stamp which you might easily overlook because it depicts stylized Wrestlers standing atop the world, truly an allegorical design to honor the International Free-Style Wrestling Championships, held in Teheran in 1959. Although this stamp won't win any popularity contest, I believe it is under-valued in today's market. No American wholesale stocks exist of this stamp, although it is still available at 60ф retail. Parisian dealers get $80 \not \subset$ for it and London dealers charge 85申. However, this stamp was issued in a quantity of only 30,000 copies, approximately equal to the edition of Persia 1047, which retails for $\$ 3.50$ in the United States and for $\$ 4.50$ in Paris and $\$ 5.00$ in London. Many Persian stamps have increased tremendously in price in recent years and I believe the time will come when this stamp, too, will cost much more. I am speaking, of course, of Persia 1133.

Peru Cl72-73 and Cl73a. Here is a set which has everything against it; issued by a very unpopular country, homely design, and issued with an ugly shade of gray dominating the two stamps. Even worse, it was issued in December, 1961, to honor the l6th Olympiad, Which had been held eighteen months earlier! Many collectors overlooked these stamps, which were released in an edition of 200,000 sets. Currently, the set retails for $75 \notin$ in New York, which is seven cents cheaper than current wholesale quotations. Overseas, the story is different; London dealers charge $\$ 1.70$ for this set although Parisian dealers get \$1.80.

The souvenir sheet, Cl73a, was released in an edition of 30,000 sheets, which is small for an airmail issue. The elusiveness of this sheet is denoted by the prices charged; in the United States the price is $\$ 1.75$ retail and $\$ 1.85$ wholesale. Dealers in Paris charge $\$ 3.50$, but $\$ 5.60$ is the price on the London market. Next year Stanley Gibbons will list this sheet in its catalogue, at which time I expect to see collector demand in Great Britain drive up the price even higher. A word to the wise is sufficient.

October black-blots. The October issue of "The American Philatelist" black-blotted two sports issues--the South Arabian state of Qu'aiti's package of eight perforate stamps and eight imperforate stamps (also one souvenir sheet) honoring the World Soccer Championship (excessive extension and intentional inclusion of oddities) and Togo's World Soccer Championship set of eight stamps and one souvenir sheet (excessive length).

Shenanigans in Ecuador. All indications point to some hanky-panky now occuring in Ecuador. The APS has questioned the validity of a two-stamp set issued to honor the World Skiing Championship; a souvenir sheet included with this set was issued in a quantity of only 10,000. Furthermore, a letter from the Ecuador Philatelic Association of Quito indicates very clearly that two Postmaster Generals of Ecuador have entered into contracts with entrepreneurs in a foreign country to pass almost the entire printing of many issues into the hands of stamp dealers. Only 50 or 60 sets were sold in Ecuador and the high values were not available to the public. Included in this group was a set depicting olympic history. Sports collectors, beware!
