Round 2 has Lincoln saying, "Go back, you dog, to the Junction. I'll call on you there soon." Davis says, "Beauregard, Let's fall back on Richmond."



Lincoln turns wrestler in Round 3 and has a diminutive Davis in a headlock while proclaiming, "I will soon smother these pirates." Round 4 has Seward asking, "Where is secession now?" to which General Scott asks "Don't you see that greasespot?"



In the final round Lincoln stands, hat in hand and victorious. He is saying "You shall have my impartial, constitutional, and humble protection!" He is surrounded by a championship belt. The American eagle flies in one corner and Miss Liberty, sans Maidenform, modestly remarks from the other, "I still live." Figures representing East and West doff their hats to Lincoln.

This set of covers shown here is on white paper. Used these covers are howling rarities. We are told that two collectors are fortunate each to have a full set used. Could be, but we've never seen them. On

our own, after years of looking, we finally came up with one used cover of the same inspiration but slightly modified, perhaps a later printing, and on yellow paper.

It is the Round 5 cover, but note that the top legend differs. It reads, "Army envelope of the Union we fight for." Ending sentences with prepositions was permissible then, apparently. The cover is addressed, fortunately, on the picture side--rather unusual on all-over patriotics. It went to a young lady in Laconia, New Hampshire, from a fond admirer (we assume) in New Orleans and is dated July

Pierre won the "Prix des Nations" event on Ali Baba (with no faults) at the Helsinki Games. Oscar Cristi of Chile was second and Fritz Thiedeman of Germany was third. Chevalier Jonqueres also won International (S.H.I.O.) Shows at Rome and Paris in 1955.

Romania

Riding "Lutteur", D'Oriola captured France's only gold medal at Tokyo by repeating his 1952 triumph in this event. He was also a member of the French silver medal team in this riding event.

WHAT THE TOPICALIST FACES WHEN HE SHOWS IN COMPETITION

4 WHAT THE TOPICALIST FACES WHEN HE SHOWS IN COMPETITION (Cont'd)

We're all agreed that how one collects stamps is strictly his own business. Each of us is completely free to accumulate what he wants and to arrange it in any manner which happens to suit his fancy.

Unfortunately, many individuals who make their efforts public by entering their presentations in competition wonder why they don't win awards. It isn't because judges don't like topical collecting. It's just because most topical collections aren't. seems to go depending on the whimsy of the exhibitor.

What are some of the factors that cause judges to shake their heads? I will use the winning exhibits on display at the recent Portales show as examples of both good and bad points without identifying the ownership.

First we should attempt a definition of what is meant by "topical", recognizing it can mean many things to many people. Reduced to its simplest form in stamp collecting, it means selecting a theme and telling a story. The stamps serve only as a media of expressing or displaying the subject matter--and nothing else. Here is where many exhibitors fall off the deep end. Details relating specifically to philately as commonly defined have no place in this presentation.

Let me start with a fine example of how to do it. Representing simplicity itself, a beautiful story simply told, was the trophy-winning exhibit "Wild Flowers of New Mexico as Depicted on the Stamps of the World". It consisted of sixteen pages in two frames. The stamps, by their beauty, colorfully told the story intended. A short paragraph relating to the flowers depicted by each stamp was all that was necessary to complete the intended theme. The stamps, of course, were identified by country, which was a perfectly logical thing to do. Scott's catalog numbers were shown. My personal opinion is this added nothing to the wtory and would better have been omitted.

Another outstanding exhibit was "Arms on Stamps--Heraldic Terms and Achievements Described and Illustrated with Stamps". It consisted of forty-eight pages in six frames. There were two problems with this exhibit and they cost its owner points.

First, the amount of write-up overbalanced the stamps shown. This is a hazard faced by all exhibitors and requires a tremendous amount of discipline to overcome. It can be This is a hazard faced done. One has to be brutal in the use of words and descriptive phrases. All extraneous material (regardless of how important it may appear to the exhibitor) simply has to be edited out. It's difficult, but the effort pays off.

In any exhibit careful consideration should be given to lay-out, but this is even more important with topicals. The eye is trained from early in life to read left to right and top to bottom. Forcing the eye to jump around for bits of information presents a serious handicap, especially when there is considerable write-up.

The major problem with this exhibit from my viewpoint as a judge, however, was the fact that the exhibitor showed too much. His story (for exhibition purposes) was completed in three frames! He should have quit when he was ahead, for everything else was extraneous to the stated theme. It possibly cost him a trophy.

Another exhibit that deserves comment was "Bibliana on Stamps -- Quotations from, and References to, Events and Persons Mentioned in the Bible". This, too, was a six-frame showing. My major criticism here relates to the use of more than one copy of the same stamp (duplicates, pairs, maximum cards, etc.). That it may have been done for "esthetic values" is beside the point. It seriously detracted from the stated purpose of the exhibit.

"Olympic Games 1896-1966--Selected Pages Taken from a Collection" represented to me a confusion of purpose. The exhibitor started out using the subjects depicted on his stamps as his theme. On his third page, however, he threw in an example of printer's waste (incidentally, spelled "waist") which had nothing whatever to do with the theme. Soon he was displaying pages of stamps loaded with irrelevant philatelic information and little information relating to the theme. The exhibit, however, possessed tremendous potential for a fine topical showing.

The above exhibits were "picked on" for they were winners in the Portales show. One can judge the quality of the remaining exhibits if he desires to take these comments at

1. A topical collection for exhibition must tell a story.

2. Write-up is necessary, but it should be as brief and concise as possible, consistent with intended objectives. Typographical errors will occur, but gross misuse of words and wrong spellings should be avoided carefully.

3. Ancillary material, if pertinent to the subject, is certainly desirable, but care needs to be exercised that it not detract from the desired goal.

4. It is advisable to shy away from multiple stories in one exhibit, no matter

how closely they may be related.

5. The temptation to sacrifice quality for quantity on the theory that large exhibits stand a better chance of winning should be avoided as the plague. It just "ain't" so.

People enter stamp shows for many reasons. It is certainly a very personal thing. As mentioned at the beginning, how one collects is his own business. If he wants to WIN in exhibitions, though, he has to slant his efforts deliberately in that direction.

A survey of any top award-winning exhibit clearly demonstrates this basic point. It is a rare person who can select pages randomly from a collection and walk away with trophies. This is particularly true in topical exhibiting.

90. Mrs. Dorothy Gulick (SPI 50), Art Hoffman (SPI 131), and Steve Gould (SPI 154) have all contributed to the answer to this little dilly. Franco Menichelli competed in the 1960 Olympic Games, winning a bronze medal in free standing gymnastics. In 1964 he produced the outstanding performance of the entire gymnastics competition with six faultless exercises in the free standing competition; of course this gained him a gold medal. Also in 1964 he was fifth in the all-around gymnastics competition; the winner was Yukio Endo of Japan. In addition to this victory in free standing exercises, Menichelli was second in the rings, and third in the parallel bars. Menichelli represented Italy.

Don Schollander won the 100-meters free style, the 400-meters free style, and was a

member of the winning 800-meters free style relay team, all of this for the United States. Both Gould and Hoffman feel that the "Halday" mentioned in the original publication of this question was an error and that the reference pointed toward Willie Holdorf of Germany. It is Holdorf who appears with Menichelli and Schollander on the Paraguayan souvenir sheets issued in March, 1965.

Holdorf won the gruelling decathlon competition in the 1964 Olympics. He scored 7,887 points to beat the Russian Rein Aun by a mere forty-five points. Holdorf was Germany's first winner in this event; his triumph marked the first time in seven Olympics that the United States did not produce the winner.

OLYMPIANA

Mr. Podolsky's article in "JSP" on the labels and cancellations prepared for the scheduled Games of 1940 awarded to Helsinki, Finland, poses the possibility of such material also having been prepared by Japan for the first awarding of the Games to Tokyo, later cancelled when she became involved in war with China.

I have not heard of, nor seen, philatelic material in the form of seals or cancellations issued by Japan, but that does not guarantee that none was prepared.

What I do have showing that pre-Olympic material was prepared by Japan is a pin about the size of a fifty-cent piece showing Mt. Fuji with the five-ring symbol and the Words, "XIII Olympiad, Tokyo, 1940". It is enameled in colors appropriate to the theme with a fluted grosgrain ribbon in purple to complete the pin.

With this evidence of Japan's preparation for the 1940 Games and the fact that she has already in circulation material for the 1972 Winter Olympics in Sapporo, there must be more philatelic material of the 1940s in existence.

Members with material, or knowledge of such, should share the infromation with SPI cohorts. It would be appreciated; let's hear from you.

THE CASES OF THE "DIRTY DOZEN"

Case 8: The Case of Win. Place. But No Show

One of the exciting thrills of philately is the running down of an elusive item. When months of seeking finally result in the acquisition of the pursued stamp, a warm feeling of satisfaction seems to perface the stamp collector's mind. Most philatelic items can be bought if the collector has sufficient patience and funds. However, some seem virtually non-existent when the hunt is on.

What would you say are the hardest sports items to find? Let's exclude imperforates, errors, varieties, and covers. My own nomination for a standard used set is Albania 384-90 (written up as Case 1). I also have a standout for a mint stamp. It isn't any of the top values of the Greek Olympics or the Colombia Baranquilla Games. By comparison it makes Greece 164 as easy to get as a United States commemorative. This is Peru 175, which shows the grandstand at the Santa Beatrice (or Santa Beatriz, if you prefer) race track at Lima, Peru.

Possibly some collectors of sports stamps do not consider this a true sports stamp. However, those of us who collect coliseums, arenas, stadiums (or stadia, if you wish), hunting lodges, and other related places certainly include this stamp. We collect horse racing (take a look at the Brown and Blue Ribbon stamps of Germany); therefore, why not the locale where the races take place? Unfortunately this race track is no longer in existence, having given way to progress in 1938 when Lima underwent growing pains and the land was better suited for other uses.

Luis Guzman P., of Lima, Peru, had an interesting article not too long ago in "Stamps" about this stamp and the set in which it occurs. His remarks were an explanation following a "tip" by the then-editor of the "Tips" column, the late Harry Weiss, who stated, "The key stamp in this set (#175) has remained at \$3.50 in the last few issues of the catalogue. Much undercatalogued and will some day be listed at \$10.00 to \$15.00. Be sure the stamp has full gum. They are known without gum. USED they are plentiful". Mr. Guzman explained the lack of gum "because of the necessity of removing the gum for climatic reasons to avoid staining and deteriorating of the stamp". He also stated that only 30,000 copies were printed (which agrees with "Michel") and that "as it was also fairly employed, unused copies are scarce. What, then, are the problems to be solved?

First, what is the first day of issue? "Landmans" and "Schmidt-Schneider" both give

February 18, 1907, but I have never seen a copy on cover, let along a first-day cover. But since they were rather commonly used (sale was continued through June 30, 1910), covers undoubtedly exist, including first-days.

Second, why are very fine mint copies with the original gum so impossible to find? I agree with Mr. Guzman that frequently gum was removed for the reasons given, but this shouldn't have occurred on all mint copies. Also, this doesn't explain the poor condition of nearly all the mint copies. Every mint copy I have or have seen has been such a poor specimen that I would be ashamed to show it to a fellow sports collector. Off-centered, creased, with no gum, partly with original gum, faded in color--this is the only way I can seem to find the stamp. Of course the low catalogue value (\$4.25) does not help matters. If the valuation were higher, fine copies might find their way into auctions. As it is, only the top value of the set (#176) pops up in auction catalogues. I've tried buying the entire set (#168-76), but with no better luck. Mr. Guzman, at the time, said that "copies with gum sell locally for the equivalent of U. S. \$15.00 or more, while the ones without gum reach normally some U. S. \$10.00". A European correspondent recently told me that the current market price for a very fine mint copy with original gum on the Continent was as high as \$60.00. For a stamp with an issue of 30,000, this seems astonishingly high.

If you find this stamp too difficult to locate, may we suggest that you settle for a copy of Peru C45. This stamp has for part of its ground scene the same race track in an almost-identical picture. Although not the easiest stamp in the world to get mint, it can be obtained much more readily.

If any readers have superb copies of #175 or copies on cover, please let our editor know so that we can clear our race track mystery. I usually wager combination tickets at the track--win, place, and show. But with Peru \$175, it's a case of Win, Place, But No Show.
