MATCHBOX LABELS

Recently a set of 120 Hungarian 'matchbox labels' came into my possession which portray many of the Modern Olympic Medalists. These labels are printed in blue and are numbered from 1-120, inscribed with the initials "M S Z" which I am told stands for "Magyar Szovetseg" (Hungarian Federation) with each label printed with a 40f value, on white paper measuring 34 x 50mm.

I believe these labels were issued in 1960, but I have as yet been unable to learn the complete story behind them, however it is doubtful that they were issued for fund raising purposes. Perhaps some of our members can shed more light on this set as well as other Hungarian matchbox labels which I have just learned do exist. I am told these labels are printed in various colors, and on various colored paper featuring athletes and views of the Rome Olympics. If any of our members have them I would like to borrow or purchase them, so that the data on them can be recorded here.

This set of matchbox labels from Hungary features a vivid history of the Modern Olympic Games from the First International Olympic Committee session of 1894 in Paris (on No. 4) down to the closing ceremonies in Rome (No. 120) where the scoreboard is lit up with the word TOKYO.

Following is a list of the Olympic Medalists pictured on this set of Hungarian matchbox labels, in alphabetical order. Names preceded by an (*) were previously listed and their records can be found in the first section of this series. As these labels were crudely printed from newspaper photographs it is doubtful if we will be able to clearly reproduce them here.

Before moving on to the team sports depicted on these Hungarian labels I would like to mention several of the other labels that are equally interesting.

The 22-year-old Italian candy-maker from Capri, winner of the 1907 Paris marathon, collapsed from exhaustion 300 meters from the finish line at the London Games and 34 seconds later the fresh-as-a-daisy Johnny Hayes of the United States crossed the finish line to win this event.

To celebrate the victories of France in the 1952 Olympic Games held in Helsinki, France prepared and issued a set of six stamps. The stamps, designed by Jacquemin, show the events in which there were French winners. Although the designer did not intend to picture the actual medalists, the French Postal Administration did indicate the various winners. They were:

- Scotts 700 - 20 fr. - Gold Medal by Jean Boiteux and Silver Medals by Mady Moreau and Gilbert Bozon in swimming.
 " 701 - 25 fr. - Two Silver Medals, both won by Alain Mimoun in track
 " 702 - 30 fr. - Gold Medals by Christian D'Oriola (individual foil) and National Team (foil) (Rommel, Buhon, Noel, Latasts, Netter and Christian D'Oriola)
 " 703 - 40 fr. - Gold Medal by Turbier and Laudet (Canadian double canoe)
 " 704 - 50 fr. - Gold Medal by Salles, Marcier, and Malivoire (rowing, two with coxswain)
 " 705 - 75 fr. - Gold Medal by Pierre Jonquieres D'Oriola (equestrian) (incidentally, the two D'Oriolas were related)

Strangely enough, the set had a poor reception when issued. They were first put on sale in Paris on November 28, 1953, and in the rest of France on November 30. Despite the fact that the stamps were much criticized, the series had to have additional printings, and the total issue amounted to 6,600,000 sets.

As with nearly all French stamps, these had what is known as the 'dated corners'. By the use of this information, it is possible to identify the various printings and the different presses. In the 'dated corner' the date is normally on the left edge, parallel with the first row of stamps, and in a vertical position. Occasionally, because of slippage, it may appear on the lower edge. The press number is generally on the lower edge of the sheet, below the 45th and 46th stamps (of sheets of 50)

The various printings are listed chronologically for each stamp. It is interesting to note that the 30 fr. remained on Press Number 7 for over two months, and that this press was not used for any other stamp in this set. Although these stamps were printed at various times, no major color errors have been noted. Slight differences in color can be discerned in the different printings.

As usual with French stamps imperforates exist. In this case 800 sets were issued imperforate. Imperforate trial color proofs also exist for the entire series. Deluxe presentation sheets also exist, but the quantity has not been published. Die proofs and trial color die proofs also exist for each stamp, and these are relatively scarce. All in all, this set represents quite a challenge for those who like to collect one item in depth.

Dear Mrs. Williams:

I have read with interest the article by Mr. Hans Abbenhuis about the World and European Championships in speed skating in the November-December 1968 issue of the Journal of Sports Philately.

It is a fine article and the first one covering the sports of skating on ice in SPI. You are to be congratulated in obtaining and including it in the Journal.

For the record, a check of the article against the official 75th anniversary history of the International Skating Union prompts me to offer some minor corrections and amplification.

The first unofficial "World" Championship in Speed Skating was held in Amsterdam in 1889 at three distances of one-half mile, one mile and two miles, the first two distances won by Alexander Panschin of Russia and the latter by Joseph F. Donoghue of the USA. Such events were again held in 1890 and 1891 with Donoghue winning in 1891 three out of five races and the first overall title, so he was really the first "World" Champion as Mr. Abbenhuis says.

No unofficial races were held in 1892, and the ISU was formed that summer and resolved to hold an official World Championship in 1893. This was held in Amsterdam and Jaap Eden of the Netherlands was the winner, and therefore the first official World Champion.

In the 1891 event, Underborg is referred to as being from Sweden. He actually represented Germany. It is worth noting about Ivar Ballangrud that he won his first World title in 1926 and his last in 1938!

Mr. Abbenhuis could well have also mentioned that the supremacy of the skaters from the Soviet Union has now declined and the athletes from the Netherlands are again in the ascendancy along with the Scandinavians, Fred Anton Maier of Norway being the 1968 World and European Champion and Stien Kaiser of the Netherlands the World Lady Champion.

The trend in stamp prices generally is down. The scarcer stamps in top condition still bring top prices, but stamps which are usually available, even though high in catalog value, are bringing only a fraction of their catalog listing. Sports stamps are still commanding fair prices, but not what they would bring if the market were firmer. Condition was listed as Fine-Very Fine or Very Fine for all these items. However, floor bidding was rather limited, and many of the lots went to mail bidders. It is impossible to say, of course, how high some of the lots might have gone if there had been more participation on the floor. Where covers were available, these went for more than the mint sets. For example, the Monaco 1939 Stadium stamps sold for \$19.50 (\$55). The same stamp tied to the official first day card sold for \$25 (\$45 as used). The Second Austria Ski set sold for \$22 (\$70). The same set on pieces, each with the special FIS cancel (not first day) went for \$32 (\$59.75 as used).

(Ed. Staff comment: The inclusion of a market trend column is one which is most certainly an area of philately many would be interested in having as a regular part of JSP. This is the first of such a column, and it is hoped that other members will make reports to your editor for inclusion in our journal. One hears of the differences in buying (and selling) via the auction method. For example: the gamble one must take when bidding by mail - how high should one bid - will there be much floor competition - will the stamps be as represented - the cost of postage and insurance that must be considered - the differences in prices realized in the southern sections of the country in comparison to the east and west. All these questions can be discussed and debated through such a column. Your comments will be welcome, let us hear from you)

In mid-summer of 1967 a group of basketball collectors set out to discover what exists in basketball philately and to compile all information for their own benefit and for the benefit of others interested in basketball philately, either now or in the future. It has been interesting, but never routine, work. Gradually, bit by bit, the bothersome little problems have been reduced in number and the remaining problems narrowed for ultimate solution.

Active to date in the early stages of the research, in addition to the author, have been Izchak Pistiner (Israel), Joe Schirmer, Henri Trachtenberg (France), Hal Wasserman, W. E. Whitesides, Barbara Williams, and Lester Yerkes. We welcome additional collaborators; volunteers should contact the author. In addition, we have used Ollie Enhagen (Sweden), John Murray (England), Ira Seebacher, and Witold Tyms (Poland) as resource personnel.

No one who has done work of this type will ever assume that a check-list is complete or accurate in all its details. One can try to hold the errors to a minimum and then ask for the cooperation of all readers in pointing out the remaining errors, in supplying the missing information for the gaps, each phase as it appears. This we particularly ask of SPI members for our project. Any pertinent comments will be welcomed at 1457 Cleveland Road, Wooster, Ohio 44691.

The first report of this project is a master check-list of perforate basketball stamps. It uses Scott, Gibbons, Michel, and Yvert catalogue numbers and lists the 'apparent' date of issue. Similar check-lists will be presented for imperforate stamps and souvenir sheets (both perforate and imperforate). Philatelic information, including much material on dates of issue, will follow. Other interesting aspects, including cancellations, are scheduled for full treatment in the more distant future.

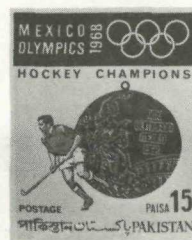
