EUROPEAN TABLE TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS

In December 1926 in the old Memorial Hall, Faringdon Street, London, a tournament was held under the name of, the first European Table Tennis Championships. Six Associations competed for the team championships and two others were represented in the individual events. The title was converted to "World Championships" at the inaugural meeting of the International Table Tennis Federation which followed immediately afterwards. Since that date, World Championships were held annually (with the exception of the war years), until 1957. At the congress of the I.T.T.F. held in Tokyo in 1956, it was decided that after 1957 the World Championships would be held biennially in years ending with an odd number.

In 1957 at the inspiration of Jean Belot, the General Secretary of the French Association, the European Table Tennis Union was formed. It was decided that the European Championships should be played in alternate years to the World Championships.

Because of the outstanding achievements of many generations of Hungarian players, the right of being host to the first championships was given to Hungary. On March 2, 1958 the first ball of the first European Championships flew across the dark green rectangle of the table in the Nemzet Sportcsarnok (National Sport Hall), in Budapest. The Championships concluded on March 9 with 15 men's and 16 women's teams from the European continent having competed.

A commemorative postmark (fig. 1), was in use for the occasion at a special post office set up for players, officials and visitors. Later in the year (August 30th), Hungary included a pair of table tennis stamps commemorating the event (Scott 1203-4). They were issued in both perforate and imperforate condition. Official post office first day covers were also issued illustrating a miscellany of equipment representing the sports depicted in the set.

The Second Championships were held from April 2nd to the 10th, during 1960 in the Exhibition Hall, Zagreb Trade Fair, Zagreb, Jugo-

slavia. Players from 30 countries took part. The only philatelic recognition of the event on this occasion was the use of a special postmark (fig. 2), and although (in my experience), this item is invariably to be found on a specially illustrated F.D.C., it was not an official issue but privately produced by a club which specializes in the production of illustrated covers to complement the numerous commemorative postmarks used in that country.

The Third European Championships were held in the Sportehall, Schoneberg, West Berlin, Germany. Mainly because of the choice of venue, only 18 countries participated on this occasion. Notable absentees were Hungary, Romania, Czechoslovakia, East Germany, USSR and other Iron Curtain countries who stayed away for political reasons. A special postmark (fig. 4), was in use during the period of the championships and I have seen two privately sponsored commemorative covers used with the cancellation. For those readers who are also interested in labels, vignettes, poster stamps, (call them what you will), a pictorial label in black and green was produced to advertise the event. (fig. 3).

The tradition of holding the championships in March/April was broken at the fourth championships. Instead they took place from November 22nd to the 29th, 1964 in the Swedish town of Malmo. This change was brought about by the fact that England, who was originally entrusted with the organization of the championships, could not fulfill the regulations of the E.T.T.U. and did not guarantee entry visas to all members of the E.T.T.U. without exception. The championships were commemorated philatelically by a special postmark (fig. 5). A privately printed illustrated cover was produced but I suspect that it must have been a very limited issue because the majority of examples of the postmark which I have seen have been on plain cover.

It can be seen from the championship results which follow this article, that the Sweden Cup is played for in the men's singles event and so it was appropriate that Kjell Johansson should win this cup in his own country. Appropriate maybe, but not surprising. Sweden has been a strong force in men's table tennis in Europe for a number of years and a glance at the records is all that is needed to see how often the names of Kjell Johansson and his compatriot Hans Alser occur in the lists.

The Fifth European Championships were held from April 13th to the 20th, 1966 in the Empire Pool Sports arena, Wembley, London, England. The pool was covered by a double floor for the occasion. The postmark illustrated (fig. 6), was in use at a special post office which was set up in the entrance hall and an official commemorative cover sponsored by the English Table Tennis Association was on sale at the souvenir counter. The motif used in the postmark, the outline of a table tennis paddle (bat), encircling a map of Europe, was also used as the emblem of the championships. In fact this device proved so popular that it was adopted as the permanent symbol to be used at future championships.

The Sixth Championships were held in the Palais des Sports, Lyons, France from April 17th to the 24th, 1968. Twenty eight nations took part on this occasion. The special postmark (fig. 7), was in use during the event. I am not aware that an official envelope was produced but I do have an example of a privately printed item. Two types of colored picture postcards were on sale to players and visitors.

One was a photograph of the Palais des Sport and the other of the Palais des Congres. (The biennial Congress of the E.T.T.U. was held in the Azure Room of the Congress Palace). Both were overprinted in blue on the picture side "VI emem Championnats d'Europe de Tennis de Table" followed by the championships symbol.

For collectors who also include postal franking machine slogans in their collections, I have also illustrated two examples (figs. 8 & 9), which were used to publicize this event. The former was used on mail emanating from the headquarters of the English T.T.A. and the latter was used by the makers of "Hallex" table tennis balls. A small oblong label comprising red lettering on a yellow background was also produced by the English T.T.A. for use on mail. It bore the legend, "EUROPEAN TABLE TENNIS CHAMPIONSHIPS, WEMBLEY, 13-20 APRIL, 1966."

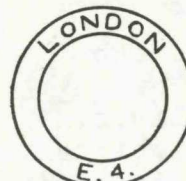
