The Tournament was held in Seoul, Korea from May 2 to May 13, 1971. Its prime purpose was to further the sports importance among the many Asiatic nations and to improve its skill and friendship among all nations. The up coming Olympic Games and the Asiatic Games were the foremost thoughts for the creation of the above tournament.

The following countries were represented in two groups. The finalists in each group then met for the championship of the tournament, competing for the handsome trophy, donated by the President of Republic of Korea, Mr. Park.

Impressive ceremonies were held at the opening of the tournament, with dignitaries of participating nations present, viewing the various delegations marching on the field. Mr. Park, the President of Korea, declared the Tournament open, and the first match between Korea and Thailand began after Mr. Park's honor kick-off.



The closing ceremony saw the winning captain receiving the trophy; farewell address; delegations marching out at an impressive fire-works display signifying the end of the tournament.

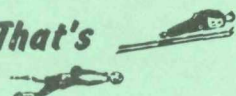

DATESTAMPS FOR THE 24th NATIONAL ATHLETIC MEET

The summer events of the 24th National Athletic Meet of Japan were held in Nagasaki Prefecture, Sept. 7-10, 1969. The winter events were also held in Nagasaki Prefecture (7 cities and 10 towns), from Oct. 26-31, 1969. There were three commemorative postal cards and one stamp issued for this meet. Commemorative datestamps were used as first day cancellations on 1-25-1969 (A), 2-13-1969 (B), and 9-6-1969 (C). All three cancels were designed by Watanabe Saburo. The cancellation used for the stamp (Scott 1017), is dated 10-26-1969 and was designed by Otsuka Hitoski (D).

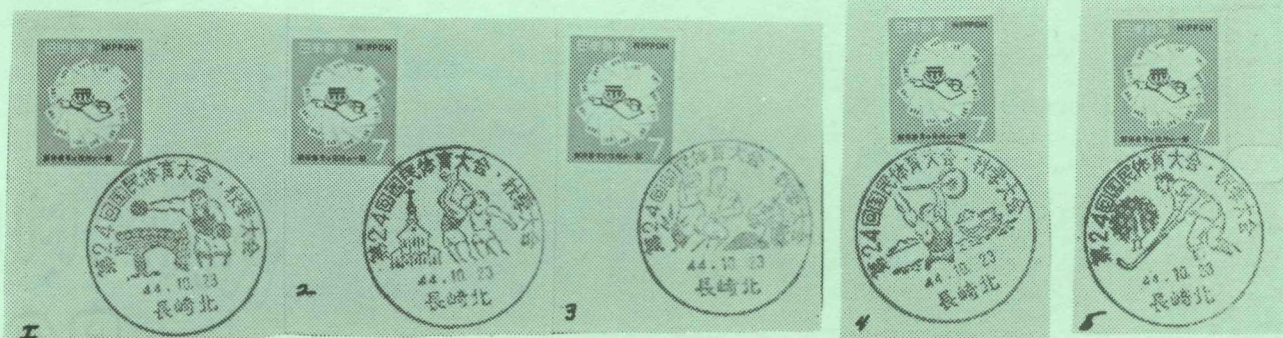

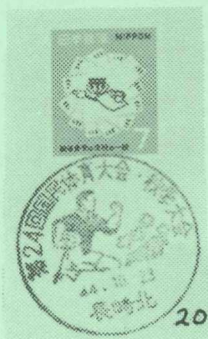

There was also a series of 34 datestamps used during the meet. The date on the illustrations, using the Japanese Year, is Oct. 23, 1969 (44th year of the reigning emperor). It is probable that these cancels were in use from Sept. 6th on through to the 31st of Oct.

Additional notes:

Handball - will be part of the 1972 Olympics, having been passed by the I.O.C. at the session in 1969.

Archery - same as handball - extra note from the Olympic event record - archery was first part of the Olympics in 1908, again in 1920 and the third time will be in 1972.

Judo - the first time was in 1964 and also will be an official sport in 1972.

Card #14 shows the symbols of the N.A.M. (they really went all-out on this one as the official emblem of the N.A.M. is the small circular that is indicated by the arrow.

The two cards on baseball are games played with a rubber ball (#'s 27-28). Card 29 evidently is the conventional baseball, also #30.

'BLACK BLOT' ASSESSMENTS - Editorial "Black Blots" are assessed against the recent postal emissions listed below, indicating one or more of the following philatelic deficiencies: (1) A limited printing or limited 'on sale' time in country or origin. (2) An excessively extended issue. (3) Unwaranted high value included. (4) No direct relationship to the issuing country. (5) Oddities intentionally included with the issue.

From the September issue of the American Philatelist

CONGO (Brazzaville): Novelty items with a Boy Scout Jamboree theme in silver and gold colored foil, including one value expressed at 1,000 francs.

DOMINICA: "Souvenir sheet" tacked-on to the normally-printed four-stamp set released with a Boy Scout Jamboree theme.

FUJEIRA: Also "blotted" is a so-called "World Boxing Championship" issue showing Clay and Frazier, and including the same philatelic wall-paper tactics as perf. and imperf. items and "souvenir sheets."

LIBERIA: A pictorial "souvenir sheet" for the world scout jamboree in Japan with a 50-cent stamp. (Note: There is no editorial assessment against the normally-printed and perforated Jamboree set.)

RAS AL KHAIMA: Eight values with baseball theme, also perf. and imperf and two "souvenir sheets."

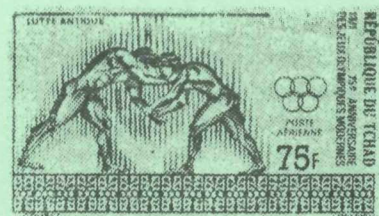
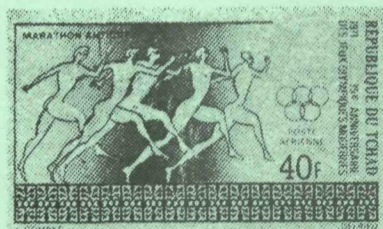

SHARJAH: Another pre-Olympic (Munich) "package" has been released in 10 expressed values, both perf. and imperf. totaling \$9 U.S.

UMM AL QIWAIN: An Olympic "package" covering both 1972 winter and summer games. "Package" includes 40 adhesives (20 perf., and 20 imperf.), four so-called "souvenir sheets." This already becomes the top "gouge" of the games which are still months away, and again brings back into focus the long-standing editorial policy of the A.P.S. to automatically assess a "black blot" on any postal items released by any nation not actually participating in the Olympic Games. This assessment accurately falls under Point 4 ("No direct relationship to the issuing country.") If a nation has not sufficient interest to qualify athletes for the Olympic Games, then it certainly defaults a reason for issuing adhesives on the pretext of the honoring the Games.
