





(2) An excessively extended issue. (3) Unwaranted high value included. (4) No direct relationship to the issuing country. (5) Oddities intentionally included with the issue.

From the November issue of the American Philatelist there were no Black-Blots listed for sport issues.

From the December issue there were the following:

FUJEIRA: November releases of pre-Olympic adhesives, including perf. and imperf. "souvenir sheets."

OMAN (STATE): More propaganda labels inscribed "State of Oman" are being foisted on the stamp collecting hobby and the latest is a "set" for the Girl Scouts, and being peddled out of Beirut, Lebanon, in a "package" of five perf. and imperf. items plus.perf. and imperf. "sheetlets." The "package" is offered in excess of \$10 U.S.

SHARJAH: An editorial "Black-Blot" is assessed against the so-called "Pre-Olympic-Sapporo Winter Games." This package totals 20 varieties perf. and imperf., plus a "souvenir sheet." \$6 plus, U.S.

Another "package" has been released to put the bite on Boy Scout collectors. This deal salutes the International Jamboree held last Aug. in Japan. The "package" includes a "gold" value, perf. and imperf. plus a "souvenir sheet." Cost is in excess of \$11 U.S.



1972 WORLD FIGURE SKATING CHAMPIONSHIPS

Benjamin T. Wright

For the fourth time in its history, a host country will issue a stamp recognizing the World Figure Skating Championships, when Canada issues a stamp for that purpost on March 1, 1972 at Calgary, Alberta.

While there have been many figure skating stamps issued in recent years by the "wall-paper" manufacturing countries, largely for the "benefit" of the Olympic topical collector, there have been relatively few issued by member countries of the International Skating Union for championships of the ISU which they have sponsored.

The first such World Championship stamp for figure skating was that of Switzerland in 1966 (Scott 470) for that year's event at Davos. In 1967 Austria issued a stamp (Scott 785) for the 100th anniversary of the Wiener Eislauf-Verein (Vienna Skating Club) in conjunction with the World Championships held in that city, while in 1971 France issued a stamp (Scott 1299) for the championship held in Lyon.

The Calgary championship is only the third to be held in canada, the prior events having been held in Montreal in 1932 and Vancouver in 1960. The championships have been held in the United States five times, first in New York in 1930 and otherwise in Colorado Springs in 1957, 1959, 1965 and 1969.

The new stamp represents a first for Calgary, no stamp having ever been issued to honor a specific sports event held in that city. It is also a first for Canada, since no stamp has ever been previously issued by that country in honor of a specific World Championship held there.

The design commission for the stamp has been awarded to the Design Workshop of Toronto.


