

Having whipped out our faithful Reporterflex with f/2.8 macro and having been ably assisted by the sterling services of the corner drug-store which undertakes to do what it fondly but over-optimistically describes as processing, we are ready with another installment of off-the-beat philatelic collections.

Perhaps more sporting than philatelic is the collecting of corner cards, foreign and domestic. We have found that their plurality can beat you down but should you assay this form of collecting, you can make it tougher by deciding on an early cut-off date or by rejecting cards not in color. Since so many SPI members are Olympic collectors exclusively, we show corner cards of the '12, '20, '24 and '28 (Winter) organizing committees from the Orovsky correspondence. A chaste and earlier entrant is that of the Royal Bermuda Yacht Club with its corner card on the back flap. Obviously the opportunities for finding such cards are many, particularly of U.S. origin. Then as another collection, you might just consider paquebot covers with sports stamp franking. Not so easily found but worth the seeking. We'll show just one posted aboard the Grace Line's Santa Rosa, franked with the Turner stamp, and cancelled at Curacao. (Fig. 8)

Perhaps we made a boo-boo in not mentioning, while on the subject of corner cards, that the field is narrower and tougher when confined exclusively to U.S. and/or foreign postal stationery. For your edification, please note the 1895 card from a Boston concern that, among

other items, carried flies for fishermen. (Fig. 9)




Another interesting pursuit--perhaps a lonely one since we know of few others interested, is the collecting of covers adorned by sport labels. We've a number, many, unfortunately, with the label on the back but ever so few are heart palpitatingly gorgeous by being labeled on the stamp side and tied by cancel. Again with deference to the Olympians a corner card from the 1912 Stockholm Games with one of the multi-colored, multi-lingual labels issued for the Games. (Fig. 10). Early U.S. examples: a 1910 cover from Taunton with a label for a Boston motor boat show and an 1896 cover from Appleton, Wis. whose label publicizes a coming statewide bicycle meet of the Wisconsin Division of L.A.W. (League of American Wheelmen). (Figs. 11 & 12).

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

Finally, for this insertion of our rambling discussion of sports philately's bypaths, you might try dipping into the tremendous area of post card collecting (may we add as a gentle jiggle, we don't mean postal cards). The early ones are often amusing, nearly always nostalgic, and surprisingly well-printed as compared with some of today's garnish eye-poppers. The two here are German with one showing a Radfahrer-Bundes (Bicyclist's League) Hotel, the other scenes of Frankfurt including a rather stately tennis match at the bottom left. (Figs. 13 & 14).

Again, may we stress our need for more photos for this series to conclude. But by now, some of you may be commencing to realize how few branches of philately cannot be topically explored.

Olympic Postal Stationery

Part II

CONTINUED FROM THE LAST ISSUE.

8. Great Britain 1948 - XIV Summer Olympic Games.

An aerogramme with imprinted stamp, bright red violet, dark blue inscriptions, bluish gray overlay on creamy gray paper. Kessler's numbers 5B, 5a stamp misplaced, printed on top of the bluish gray overlay. 5b. Albino impression of stamp. 5c. Stamp printed with aniline ink, can be distinguished under an ultra violet ray lamp. H&G #4. Godinas Airmail Catalog #'s A5, A5a.

9. Austria 1948 Commemorating the XIV Summer Olympic Games.

(A) Postcard with imprinted 1S+50g dark blue Olympic Flame imprinted stamp (type Scott B224). Vertical line down center of card separating the address lines on right from blank space on left for message or otherwise.

(B) Postcard, same as (A) with printed text on card: Osterreichischer Olympiatag (Austrian Olympic Day). Edition 10,000.

Both (A) & (B) have printed, in German, across the top: "Issued by the Austrian Olympic Committee to aid the Olympic Fund". Also between the imprinted stamp and the vertical line, the printed word: "Korrespondenzkarte". These cards were printed to private order with paper


usually furnished by the buyer (in this case, the Austrian Olympic Committee); and usually with stamp of color or value other than those of regular issues. Although in this instance the imprinted stamp has the same value and color as the regular issue, B224. There is uncertainty and doubt whether item (B) above with the text "Osterreichischer Olympiatag" exists as such. Item (A) is known to have gone through the mails and was cancelled with a round cancel reading: Wein/Osterreicher Olympiatag 1948.

Closely related to postal Olympic stationery, in a rather unique way, is an interesting airmailed registered and censored FDC dated Jan. 16, 1948 with Austria B224 attached to the cover, issued by Austria-Philatelist Verlag Adolf Koselwien, is a postal stationery envelope with a pair of imprinted stamps-a green 12g Franz Schubert and a brown 18g Franz Grillparzer-overprinted in red block letters across the pair of imprinted stamps the word "Ungültig" (invalid) and above the pair, in red, the word "Drucksache!" (printed matter). Also printed in the upper left corner in red, "First Day-Ersttag/(Olympic Torch and Rings)/Olympiajahr/1948". If the values had not been invalidated or voided, this item would have been an Olympic postal stationery item. The postage which carried this item were two regular B224 stamps which were postally cancelled.


10. Austria 1952 in connection with XV Olympic Games Helsinki.

(A) Postcard 1S+50g dark blue Olympic Flame imprinted stamp (type Scott B224). Same as postcard 9A with new text in German: "I Austrian Sport and Olympic Stamp Exhibition/First Day of Olympic Stamp 1952/26 January 1952". Further printed under word "Korrespondenzkartz" is a blue rectangle inscribed in white "Mit Flugpost/Par Avion".

(B) Postcard 1S+50g dark blue Olympic Flame imprinted stamp, same as postcard (9A), however with new text, "Olympia-Sonderflug Wien-Helsinki/17 Juli 1952" in white on blue background at lower left.

(C) Envelope (airmail type) with 1S ultramarine "Tirol" girl in native costume (type Scott 537), imprinted stamp. At upper left imprinted text in white letters on blue rectangle "Olympiade-Sonderflug/Wien-Helsinki/(Olympic Rings)/17 Juli 1952". At lower left blue rectangle inscribed white letters "Mit Flugpost/Par Avion". This envelope is actually an air-letter sheet folded vertically in half and then horizontally in half into an envelope forming an aerogram. The author has not seen any of these that have actually gone through the mails, and know if enclosures were allowed in the envelope formed or whether sheet had to carry message. This envelope or sheet was printed to private order as the notation under the stamp has the date "29 August 1951". There exists many such envelopes in postal stationery with different costume designs and different values, however without any Olympic connotation such as this folded air-letter.

11. Germany - West Berlin 1953.

(A) Postcard with 20pf red Olympic stadium imprinted stamp (type Sc, 9N102). The design shows the east entrance to the Berlin Olympic Stadium. Gray white in color, issued in 1953. There is a red vertical line down the center and imprinted between the line and stamp "Postkarte mit Anwortkarte/Carte Postale Aver Reponse Payee". Below stamp at right of line are lines for addressee's name and address. To the left of line, at upper left, is small red circle and lines and instructions for sender's name and address.

(B) Postcard attached to (A) with same imprinted stamp. However the red line down the center has small red circle, and the wording is "Carte Postale-Reponse/Postkarte-Antwort. Both (A) & (B) together are foreign rate reply cards. H&G #26.

12. Germany - West Berlin 1951/55.

(A) Envelope with 20pf red Olympic Stadium, east entrance imprinted stamp (type Scott 9N102). This is one of a series of envelopes, made to private order, during 1951 to 1955, with imprinted stamps and designs showing pictures of Berlin buildings.

13. Austria 1954 on the occasion of the 2nd Sports Stamp Exhibition.



(A) Postcard 1S+50g dark blue Olympic Flame imprinted stamp (type Sc B224), the basic card (9A), now with new text, in green, "Olympische Festwochen 1954/2.Sportbriefmarken Ausstellung.

14. Australia 1956 Commemorating the XVI Olympic Summer Games.



(A) Aerogram, 10d red coat of arms of Melbourne imprinted stamp at the left, Olympic Stadium in red, and 5 Olympic Rings below it in black. At upper left, three pennant flags, respectively inscribed, "Aerogramme", "By Airmail", "Par Avion". At bottom, across the entire aerogram, text, "XVIth Olympiad Melbourne 1956" in black letters. At right, below stamp, 4 lines for addressee's name and address. This aerogram is also available with a spelling error on the imprinted stamp, MELBOURNF. See illustrations. H&G #'s F8 & F8a.

We might also note here that Australia issued another aerogram with a rectangular box in upper corner with notation within "Affix Two Postage Stamps total value 10d." At left side appears "Par Avion", Oly. Rings and picture of small cottage, with notation below it "Olympic

Village Melbours Australia 1956" and also "Approved by the Postmaster General for acceptance as airletter no. 26." However, by our definition of postal stationery, this is not so, because it did not have an imprinted stamp to carry it through the mails.

15. Austria 1956 in Connection with the Melbourne Games.

(A) Postcard 1S+50g dark blue Olympic Flame (type B224) imprinted stamp. Again our basic 1948 postcard, with new text, at lower left blue lettering in white rectangle, "Österreichischer/Olympia Sonderflug/(Olympic Rings and two Flames)(XVI. Olympiade/Wien-Nordpol-Melbourne". However, between the center vertical line and the stamp, the word "Korreponderkarte" is in black across the blue rectangle, with the white words "Mit Flugpost", and not above the rectangle as on the basic card. Further, under the rectangle, printed in blue "Via SAS Nordpolroute".



This serial is a simplified handbook of adult competitive sports on stamps. The definitions, and thus the inclusions and exclusions, are those of the compiler alone. Knowing the controversies which can easily arise, he quarrels with, or apologizes to, none of his fellow sports collectors for his choices. This handbook presents only one individual's idea of a complete sports collection; others are perfectly free to pattern their own collections as they wish.

Two basic definitions apply:

1. Adult--typically participated in by physically mature individuals beyond the age of approximately thirteen or fourteen
2. Competitive sports--physically demanding, vigorous sports whose major goal is competition

The handbook includes:

1. Only stamps, including errors, proofs, covers, cancellations, seals, labels, and maximum cards
2. All stamps and sheets which portray sports even though they may not be part of a specially-issued sports set
3. All components of a specially-issued sports set even though some individual items in the set do not depict sports
4. All components of a specially-issued sports set even though a given design may be common to several members
5. All sports stamps and sheets overprinted for any purpose, including use in a country other than the country of issue
6. A few overprinted stamps and sheets whose initial subject matter and/or reason for issue has nothing to do with sports, but whose overprints qualify them

Careful application of these principles produces an important series of delimitations. Not included are stamps and sheets depicting:

1. Activities of boy scouts, girl scouts, and other similar youth organizations and sets issued in their honor. If an individual stamp or sheet portrays a competitive sports activity, normally engaged in principally by adults, it is included.
2. Children's play activities and sets issued in behalf of child welfare. Again, if an individual stamp or sheet portrays juvenile use of a predominantly adult competitive sport, it is included.
3. Active recreation, including boating (for pleasure), camping, cycling, fishing, folk dancing, hunting, mountain climbing, swimming, etc.
4. Inactive recreation, including bridge, chess, stamp collecting, etc.

5. Native archery, boating, fishing, and hunting
6. Aviation activities, except for gliding and parachuting

The cut-off date for inclusion is the end of December, 1972. Since some major catalogues permit delays in description of as great as three or four years, there are a few major omissions.

This handbook is based directly on the compiler's Simplified Checklist of Adult Competitive Sports on Stamps, currently running serially in the Journal of Sports Philately. Although it operates in a more narrowly defined field, this handbook is partially an extension of Ira Seebacher's Handbook of Sports Stamps, published serially in SportStamps and the Journal of Sports Philately.

Two members of Sports Philatelists International, Hal Wasserman and Jim Yarwood, have contributed directly to the project. Thanks are also due to SFT and its officers for their encouragement and for financial support during the early stages of the project.

The compiler acknowledges the errors and omissions which may exist in the handbook and accepts full responsibility for them.
