## Olympic Postal Stationery

#### 16. Czechoslovakia 1953.

(A) Postcard, with 30h brown, head of President Zapotocki, imprinted stamp. At left picture of canoe being loaded onto airplane at top: "Ceskoslovenski Aerolinie 1923 29X.1953". Below picture, text, in Czech, "Airplane CSA Serves Our Sports Loading Canoe for Olympic Games (Letaldo CSA Slovzi Nosemu Sportu Doprava Kanoi na Olympiadu). The color of the card is buff and is one of a series of 16 view cards headed "Ceskoslovenski Aerolinie" issued for the airlines 30th anniversary.

#### 17. Austria 1960 in connection with XVII Olympic Summer Games, Rome.

(A) Postcard with 1S+50g dark blue Olympic Flame imprinted stamp (type B224), our basic 1948 postcard. At left with multicolored shield inscribed: "XVII Olymp. Spiele/Ostterreich/(Austrian Eagle) /5 Olympic Rings/Italy's Official Games Emblem of suckling wolf and Remulus & Remus and date MCMLX". Above shield, in blue letters, "Olympia Sonderflug" with AUA flight insignia, and below shield in red letters, "Wien-Rom". The usual blue rectangle, with white lettering of Flugpost/Airmail/Par Avion, is at lower right and not at upper left.

#### 18. Austria 1960 in connection with VIII Winter Games, Squaw Valley.

(A) Postcard with 1S+50g dark blue Oly. Flame imprinted stamp (type B224). Our basic 1948 card with new text in blue and red "Osterreichische Olympia-Sonderflugpost Wien-Squaw Valley/Mit TWA Transworld Airlines", also Olympic Rings above text with 2 red horizontal lines, and the usual blue rectangle below text.

#### 19. Poland 1962 in connection with founding of Olympic Philatelists Club in Warsaw.

(A) Postcard with 40 gr green, red, white ski ornaments imprinted stamp, (type not issued as a regular stamp). At lower left picture view of Zakopane.

(B) Postcard with 40 gr green, red, white ski ornaments imprinted stamp. At the left picture of skier in full flight.


Both (A) & (B) issued for the FIS events in Zakopane with additional text as follows: I Ogólnopolski Zjazd/Klub Filatelistow/Olimpijczykow H & G #209 for both cards.

20. Russia 1961 in connection with XVII Olympic Summer Games, Rome.

- (A) Cacheted envelope with 4k red coat of arms imprinted stamp, cachet - weightlifting.
- (B) Same, 4k red stamp - boxing
- (C) Same, 4k red stamp - fencing
- (D) Same, 4k blue stamp - running
- (E) Same, 4k brown stamp - steeplechase
- (F) Same, 4k blue stamp - canoeing
- (G) Same, 4k brown stamp - gymnastics

The cachets each have the same color as the respective imprinted stamp, and below each cachet at left of envelope, is the text: "CAABA?COBETC-KNM

On the flap of each envelope is the official imprint with date 24/XI-60r. Moscow and the name of the designer, presumably of cachet and respective stamp, is also given in each case, and also the price of the envelope. The cachets correspond to the set of 10 Olympic stamps issued by Russia on Aug. 1, 1960 (Sc. 2359-2368). It is not known at this writing if cacheted envelopes were issued for the 3 other sports, namely basketball, diving wrestling, also depicted on the Olympic stamps. Several of the above envelopes (A) to (G) have also received different text imprints for other sport events.



21. Russia 1962 on occasion of the 59th session of International Olympic Committee in Moscow, June 8, 1962.


- (A) Cacheted envelope with 4k brown, coat of arms pattern and year 1961, imprinted stamp. At left of dotted lines for address is cachet of Olympic emblem and official imprint on envelope flap with date 28/2-62r.

22. Austria 1964 commemorating the 9th Olympic Winter Games, Innsbruck.

Austria issued 69 different view-picture postcards, each imprinted with the 1.80S lilac, woman figure skater stamp (type Scott 714). At left is a picture view of a famous tourist place in Austria with tourist propaganda text below the picture, and above the picture the text: "Besuchet Österreich! Come to Austria! Visitez L'Austriche! A total of 69 of these postcards were issued. Higgins & Gage assigns #384 to the series and #384a for any one of the singles. There are three series as listed below:

- 37. Edition foreign. Picture series No. 1 thru 16.
- 38. Edition foreign. Picture series No. 1 thru 28.
- 39. Edition foreign. Picture series No. 1 thru 26, without a No. 9 which is non-existent.

8. Bregenz, Festspiele, Vorarlberg. (festival performance at night)
9. Feldkirch, Vorarlberg. (medieval city - historic castle).
10. Feldkirchen, Karnten. (holiday resort - mountains & lake).
11. Maria Worth-Reifnitz-Dellach-Seekirn am Worthersee, Karnten. (popular summer holiday resort).
12. Portschach am Worthersee, Karnten. (Austria's "Riviera").
13. St. Johann in Tirol. (summer holiday resort & winter sports center).
14. Seeboden am Millstattersee, Karnten. (lake bathing station).
15. Steindorf am Ossiachersee, Karnten. (lake bathing resort).
16. Velden am Worthersee, Karnten. (world famous holiday resort).



Danner, James F., The 1936 Olympic Games: A Philatelic History.  
Whitesboro, N. Y.: Author, 1972, 71 pp., \$3.95.

The red spiral binding and flexible, red-on-white cover give this new publication an attractive external appearance. Printed by off-set from a typewritten master, the copy is clear and easily read; 8½" x 11" semi-glossy paper is used throughout. The illustrations are numerous, including stamps, seals, cancels, and postal stationary; all, even the sketches of cancels, are distinct and completely legible. The requirements of grouping similar types for reproduction sometimes prohibit an illustration from accompanying directly its specific text, but a little search solves this minor problem.

The general scheme of the publication is to place the 1936 Winter and Summer Olympic Games in the proper political and economic setting, showing how the Nazi government hoped to use the Games for publicity for its doctrines and how the Games, although highly successful athletically, did not always accomplish the desired goal.

The most effective description of the contents is to cite the chapter headings:

Chapter IV	The Winter Games
Chapter V	The Climate of Berlin

There is excellent balance among the historical commentary, the political and economic background, the athletic performances, and the philatelic description. All in all, the publication is thorough as a philatelic record, yet completely entertaining.


