

A 3-RING CIRCUS IN 1976?

Are you making plans to visit Canada in 1976? If your not, make plans to "reserve all available television time" because you might be in for the most exciting games ever! Perhaps were sticking our neck way out, but early in 1973 an event occured in the sporting world which makes us believe it will be a battle between the USA, USSR and Mainland China.

We recall 1954 and 1956--In 1954 Russia entered the World Hockey Games and promptly won first place. In 1956 Russia entered the Olympic Games--for the first time--and you know what happened ever since.

World Hockey rules have changed somewhat since 1954. Now a "new member" must start in group "C" and work up to group "A" in order to compete for the medal. Well, what happened in 1973? Yes, Red China entered the World Hockey Games--of course, they have not been mentioned on any of the daily sport pages but the fact is that China did beat France and Great Britain, and tied Bulgaria and Denmark, finishing 2-2-3. Now, let us see how Red China figures the Games. 1973 was their first year; 1974 they figure to lead group "C", advancing to group "B" 1975 they figure to be near the top, and or winning group "B" by 1976. REVIEWS

"Handbook of Fish and Game Stamps." By E. L. Vanderford. Published by the State Revenue Society and available from the society at 1441 Urbana Lane, Lincoln, NE. 68505. Price \$3.50 postpaid.

Kansas issued a 50¢ quail stamp in 1937. Since that time 34 states and a number of countries have issued a great variety of stamps for use on hunting and fishing licenses. The stamps vary from plain typeset issues to multi-color stamps rivaling in attractiveness the well-known US duck stamps. Nearly every North American game animal and many species of fish have been used in the designs. All of these stamps are related to biology and wildlife conservation, a collecting area which has attracted many new collectors in the past few years.

For the first time all known state-issued stamps in this area are described in a single book. This study was originally serialized in the State Revenue Newsletter over a period of six years. To make the listing as up-to-date as possible, 79 pages of addenda have been added to the original 195 pages. Over 1,650 stamps are described and 575 actual size illustrations are included in the text to show every known major design.

The mimeographed book is available on 8½ X 11" pages punched to fit a three-ring binder which will facilitate making the additions which are constantly require in this area. (Review from Western Stamp Collector.)

APS SPI ATA

Jean Pride Stearns and revised by Russell A. Fink. Available from the author, PO Box 250, Lorton, VA 22079. Price \$35. postpaid.

This 100 page book is in three-ring format so that it may be kept up to date by the addition of new pages each year. The pages are contained in a handsome gold-stamped binder.

Of interest to collectors of US Duck Stamps is the fact that it may be used as an album for the stamps, space being provided for a single specimen of each year's issue.

This book contains pictures of the designs, data about the original art, prices, market value and technical information concerning the prints and comprehensive biographies of the artists.

The pages are of 65-pound paper of extremely high quality and are commensurate with the beauty of the printing.

The edition is limited to 1,500 numbered copies and owners will be notified each year of the annual supplemental pages. (Review from Western Stamp Collector.)

(Editor's note: I have not seen either of these books but if you are a collector of hunting and fishing in the sports area, these are for you.)

"Checklist of Sports & Recreation." By Robert M. Bruce (SPI 1). Published by the American Topical Association and available from the society at 3308 N. 50th St., Milwaukee, Wis. 53216. Price \$4. postpaid.

The second edition, 1973, of Sports & Recreation Checklist, Handbook No. 83 is offset printed, 48 pages, 8½ X 6" with a soft cover and has many illustrations. Scott catalog numbers are used throughout and for non-Scott listed issues, numbers are used from Minkus, Gibbons, Michel and Yvert-Tellier.

The contents are (1) Competitive Sports: Aquatic (diving, sailing swimming, water skiing, etc.), Ball (baseball, basketball, football, soccer, tennis, etc.), Combative (archery, boxing, fencing, judo, etc. Racing (auto, bkie, horse, etc.), Track and Field and others.

(2) Active Recreation (boating, hunting, fishing camping etc.) Specific Athletic Competitions (Olympic Games, Olympic sanctioned, regional, pseudo-Olympic Games, other world, regional and national competitions (4) Other sports Subjects (awards and trophies, athletes, parades, etc.). This is an all inclusive handbook covering the entire sports field which every SPI member should have in his library.




A BIG QUESTION MARK FROM PRAGUE





In April 1973 the Czechoslovak Postal Authorities overprinted the two stamps, on top right, with legends, top left: "ČSSR (Czechoslovak Socialist Republic) — World-Champion", in Czech and Slovak languages. The original issue appeared prior to the World Ice Hockey Championship, the overprinted after its conclusion to commemorate the victory of the national squad. The overprints, first Czech — second Slovak, appear in that order, they were also overprinted in that order on the original stamps. All the known facts end here. The rest is confusing at best. Why this issue was reported first as 200,000 and later as 210,000 pairs overprinted? Why on the market this set is practically unknown? We all know that there can't be that many collectors of Czechoslovakia, sports collectors declined very sharply over the last years. The Czech Authorities did not stock this issue because they are buying it from collectors now! So are dealers in Germany. The set sold as new issue at 50¢! This set deserves a very careful attention, it may become a modern rarity; and don't be misled by the fact that this issue comes from a "socialist" country.






