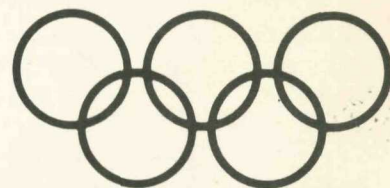

SPORT ISSUES AMONG THE SWISS MILITARY STAMPS OF WORLD WAR II

(Assoc. Editor's Note: Bob recently opened a new field of sports philately to me with his "Swiss sports." When I suggested the article to him, he complied almost immediately and that should speak well for his philatelic knowledge - Joe Schirmer.)

During World War II, military units in Switzerland issued over 2,200 different stamps (in some 10,000 varieties), primarily for aid to needy soldiers and their families, but sometimes for the use of the unit itself -- guard houses, entertainment, etc. There is controversy over the status of these "stamps." They did not carry the mail, because all soldiers' mail went post free, except mail abroad, registered and express letters, and parcels over 6 pounds. But the post office allowed their use to aid in sorting mail. Whatever their true philatelic status, they are a colorful and generally inexpensive addition to Swiss and topical collections

Over 80 of these stamps were issued to help finance Army sport championships during the war; and at least one of the regular issues was overprinted in honor of a sporting event. This article lists these various sport-related issues and notes the existence of others.

The basic reference to these stamps is an out-of-print dealer's catalog issued in 1943 by Paul Locher and Robert Forestier, supplemented through 1964. Their arbitrary numbering system is used in this article. The article is based in part on the A.M. (Armeemeisterschaften or "Army Championships") class of that catalog and in part on my collection.

FIFTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

The fifth championships (the first held during World War II) were held in Basel on September 4 through 7, 1941. A special souvenir card was released and two cancels were used, one by the post office and the other by the Army Field Post. The stamps were each in red, grey-green and black and were printed in strips of five different designs. There are four different strips of five with the same five designs, but with German, French, Italian and Romansh text, respectively. They were de-

signed by Numa Rick, Basle, and were printed by Wassermann, S.A., Basle. All strips are found perforated 11 and imperforate. The text on all the stamps may be translated: "Fifth Swiss Army Championships, Basle."

At some later time all of these stamps were overprinted in gold diagonally: "MILITARWETTMAERSCH FRAUENFELD". I have never seen used copies. The Army cancellation for the 1943 Winter Games (see below) was similar; "Armee-WettKampfe." This overprint may have been for a competitive hike held at Frauenfeld, a small town north-west of Winterthur. Locher numbered these strips 23 (German Text), 25 (French text) 27 (Italian text) and 29 (Romansh text), respectively. The overprinted strips are also found imperforate.

The exact format of the sheets from which these stamps come is not clear. We know that all four overprinted strips appear with selvage on all four sides. I have the overprinted French, Italian and Romansh strips imperforate with this same selvage but with the legend in black at bottom: "EN FAVEUR DU DON NATIONAL," "A FAVORE DEL DONO NAZIONALE SVIZZERO," and "A FAVUR DEL DUN NAZIONAL SVIZZER," respectively. The German would probably be "ZUGUNSTEN DER SCHWEIZ NATIONALSPENDE." (In favor of the National Fund"; this fund was for the benefit of needy soldiers, and proceeds from several semi-postal Pro Patria sets and special flights were given to this foundation.) It may be that the "strips" were printed only in these sheetlets, but they may also have been printed in fuller sheets containing several strips. Locher used the word "strip" to describe both types elsewhere in his catalog.

SIXTH CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Sixth Army championships were held in Fribourg August 27 through 30, 1942. The Field Post issued a special circular cancellation and the Post Office a special rectangular mark. Six stamps were also issued in dark green, red, blue, yellow and (imperforate) black, all occurring in a sheet of six, both perforate 11 and imperforate. The artist was H. Broillet. These stamps were numbered 71 thru 76 by Locher.

WINTER GAMES, 1943

The Army held winter games at Adelboden on February 23 through 28, 1943. Again, a special card was issued and two special cancels were employed by the Post Office and the Field Post. Sixteen different stamps were issued, all of a similar type and all in green and black, in perforated 11 and imperforate sheets of four. Locher Nos. 77-80 is on white paper with German text. Locher's Nos. 81-84 occur on green paper with French text; Nos. 85-88 occur on blue paper with Italian text and Locher Nos. 88-92 occur on buff paper with Romansh text.

POSTPONED CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Army scheduled championship at St. Gallen in 1944, but they were postponed because of a general mobilization. The rescheduled games were not held in 1945 because of the end of the war. To cover the cost of organizing the games and to raise funds for soldier's sports, the following three sets (numbered by Locher 93 through 104x) were sold in August 1945 both with and without the overprint: "Wahrsportfond" (Military Sport Fund) in black.

Locher Nos. 93-98, 103

Locher's listing is somewhat confusing but 93-98 and 103 basically break down into two sets. The first set was printed in two different sheets. The first sheet (containing all seven stamps), which Locher numbered 104, and he numbered the same sheet without the two black overprints "Wehrsportfond" as 104x; both sheets are perf. 11. None of the stamps themselves were overprinted. Imperforate versions of these sheets were numbered 104a and 104ax, respectively.

Locher listed the large center stamp as No. 103. It is green, black and red and occurs only in the sheet of seven.

The six smaller stamps were printed not only in the sheet of seven but also together in sheets of six, perforated 11 and imperforate, in both cases apparently with marginal inscriptions (not known to me). No. 93 was printed in green, black and red; 94 in brown, yellow, black and red; 95 in the same colors as 94; 96 in the same colors as 93; 97 in lilac, red and black; and 98 in blue, red and black. Nos. 93-98 each have a horizontal overprint "Wehrsportfond" at or near the top, and 93x-98x are without the overprint. I do not believe single copies of 93x-98x and 93ax-98ax (without overprints) from the sheets of six and seven are distinguishable (unless with wide selvage).

Locher Nos 99-102

The second set of the 1944 issues was printed in a sheet of four containing four different stamps in four different languages without marginal inscriptions. The issue appears both with and without the overprint at the far left, and both perforated 11 and imperforate. The stamps are numbered 99-102 with the overprint and 99x-102x without the overprint. No. 99 is red, pink and black (German text), 100 is green, red and black (French text), 101 is blue, red and black (Italian text) 102 is lilac, red and black (Romansh text); and the overprint is in black.

PRICES

Locher priced these stamps as set forth in the following check list. His revision was published in November, 1964, and prices are in Swiss francs. Unpriced items (marked "-.-") may or may not be rare; Locher did not price items where quantities were so small that realistic values could not be assigned. He specifically warned that this could occur as the result of speculation. Collectors should therefore exercise restraint in purchasing unpriced stamps.

REGULAR ISSUE - WINTER GAMES - 1945

In the regular military issues a stamp issued by the Tenth Mountain Brigade honors the brigade's own winter championships held at Montana and Crans in 1945. (Locher No. Army 63III.) The artist was J.P. Kaiser, and the printer was Klausfelder S.A., Vevey. The stamp is in brown, black, blue and light green and is perforate 11. It appeared in a sheetlet of four, without marginal inscription. The stamp was priced at 4.00 Swiss francs and the sheet at 20.00 Swiss francs.

OTHER REGULAR ISSUES

Sport-related motifs appear on several other military stamps--calvary horses, leaping hurdles, skiers on maneuvers, bicyclists motorcyclists, etc. -- but these were issued by military units using sport equipment in military applications.
