

## Guasti Giulii and the

## 1932 Los Angeles Olympics



Listed in Trory's Philatelic History of the Olympic Games and in Rampacher's Catalog of Olympic Games Vignettes is one seal measuring 90 mm X 94 mm attributed to Guasti Giulii, Inc. (Say Julie). Listed as 165(V95) by Trory and as 1932 Los Angeles No. 52 by Rampacher, the vignette is officially described as being black on yellow paper. Copies I have seen all appear to be orange rather than yellow.

The design is an obsolete type of humorous art by Billy Hon whose name appears on the vignette. United States Tires now is better known with its tires under the Uniroyal brand.

A larger, gummed-on-the-face vignette is known but unlisted by either Rampacher or Trory-- probably because it is closer to the window sticker size rather than stamp-size. Our smiling, perspiring runner appears in natural colors. The shoes are brown. On the shirt, "1932" appears on black on a bright red stripe. All writing is in black. The background color is white. The reverse side is blank and ungummed.



The larger vignette measures 143 mm across the base and 185 mm high. The outer black design border closely parallels the edge.

Neither Trory or Rampacher illustrate these designs. Do other SPI members have similar material not previously illustrated and reported?

#### 1972 Singlehanded Transatlantic Race

The first singlehanded transatlantic race was not held until 1962. At that time only five yachts entered with an average boat length of 27 feet. The winner was Sir Francis Chichester in a 39 foot GIPSY MOTH III with a crossing time of 40 days. (Note: Chichester's GIPSY MOTH IV has been recognized philatelically on Great Britian's #517 and Qutar's #121.)

The series was continued in 1964, '68 and '72 with each race producing more entries, larger boats and faster lapsed times than the previous race. The competition has been keen and demanding. Many of the boats finishing well have been designed specifically for this

type of racing.

The 1972 race was commemorated by Equatorial Guinea with a set of seven values and two souvenir sheets. The set pictures most of the top finishers in this event. Because of the high risk of singlehandedly racing 3,000 miles across the Atlantic, strict safety requirements were enforced. These included a minimum of 500 miles sailed by both boats and skippers singlehanded. The Guinea set illustrates some of the radical design variations of the yachts.

GOLDEN VANITY (Equatorial Guinea 1 pta, Fig. 1) was the last of fifty-five entrants to finish the race. It took Peter Crowther of England eighty-eight days to complete the passage from Plymouth, England to Newport, Rhode Island. The sixty-five year old pilotcutter was the oldest boat entered. It is a thirty-eight foot gaff rigged veteran of five transatlantic crossings. Light headwinds resulted in Crowther choosing the most southern route shown on the stamp. He sailed nearly to the Azores but never excaped the wind problem. Chafe rather than storm damage was the constant nemesis as Crowther had resewn his jib topsail and replaced his running rigging three times enroute.

TOUCAN (E.G. 2 pta, Fig. 2) a 34.5 foot one-design boat much like a 5.5 meter, came in a surprising ninth. Alain Gilksman of France was able to outrace most of the monohulls under fifty feet in length while taking a southern route. He had sailed into Plymouth just 40 minutes before incurring a 24 hour penalty at the start of the race. His boat was built in only two months for under \$20,000. TOUCAN has a narrow hull, two ton displacement, 70% ballast ratio, and a general absence of electronic instrumentation and other gear. Just the fact that the boat never capsized, with only a foot of freeboard and its lack of bouyancy, is remarkable. It proved that bigness is not the only requirement of a competitive singlehanded yacht. Gilksman won the trophy for the fastest crossing by a competitor in a boat less than thirty-five feet long.

STRONGBOW (E.G. 3 pta, Fig. 3) a slim sixty-five foot monohull sailed by Martin Minter-Kemp of England finished eighth. The boat fell off a big wave some 1,000 miles from the finish and suffered minor structural damage but Minter-Kemp was able to nurse it into Newport. The boat was especially designed and built for the event and holds promise of being heard from again.

THREE CHEERS (E.G. 5 pta, Fig. 4) is a forty-six foot Trimaran sailed by fifty-three year old Tom Follet of the United States to a fifth place finish. This was the highest U.S. finish in 1972. In the '68 race, Follet had shocked everyone with a third place finish in his unconventional designed CHEERS. These mulit-hulled boats are

APS SPI ATA conceeded to be faster than mono-hulls, however, they are tricky to handle especially over such a long solo race. Both boats were designed by Dick Newick of St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands. THREE CHEERS is built of moulded plywood, has fore and aft center boards and a small mizzen. This meant that should the self-steering devices fail the boat could be more easily controlled by trimming the centerboards and mizzen.


BRITISH STEEL (E.G. 8 pta, Fig. 5) sailed by a bank manager, Brian Cook, was the first British and the first "conventional" monohull to arrive. It finished forth overall. This was a disappointment to designer Robert Clark who had previously designed the ketch SIR THOMAS LIPTON which won the 1968 race.

CAP 33 (E.G. 15 pta, Fig. 6) one of the many French multi-hulls designed for this race, finished third. It was the fastest of all the yachts taking the most southern route that appears on the stamp. However, it still finished three days behind the leader. CAP 33's living quarters were exceptionally small. Jean-Marie Vidal was the skipper.

VENDREDI TREIZE, which is French for "Friday the 13th", was recognized on the 250+50 pta souvenir sheet, Fig. 7 of Equatorial Guinea. This was the most unconventional boat in the 1972 race. It is a 128 foot three masted schooner of 35 ton displacement. By comparision a twelve meter boat displaces 27 tons and carries a racing crew of eleven. The boat was designed by Dick Carter and skippered by twenty-eight year old Frenchman, Jean Yves Terlain. Terlain was a veteran of the 1968 race and expected strong winds of force six or more in this race. His boat was the pre-race favorite with its three 1400 square foot genoas. In mid-ocean, the two leaders, PEN DUICK IV and VENDREDI 13 met. The odds are fantastic at this occuring. But winds never exceeded force five the second half of the race-giving Terlain a distinct disadvantage. He still was able to hold on to second place.

PEN DUICK IV, which appears on the 250+50 pta, Fig. 8, souvenir sheet as well as the 50 pta, Fig. 9, regular issue, is a sixty-seven foot aluminum trimaran ketch. Alain Colas, twenty-eight years old, purchased PEN DUICK IV from designer and world renouned skipper Eric Tabarly. It is the same boat that was forced out after a collision early in the 1968 solo race. Colas overcame a failure of his self-steering linkage and was able to achieve remarkable speed to windward during the entire race. Previously monohulls were concidered to have a decisive advantage when sailing on this tact. PEN DUICK IV finished first, nineteen hours ahead VENDREDI 13. It set a new recond of just  $20\frac{1}{2}$  days--or five days and eight hours better than the previous recond and in half the time required for the first singlehanded transatlantic

race, twelve years earlier.

This race also marked the first time a women ever raced across the Atlantic alone. French women, Marie Claude Fauroux, accomplished the feat in a respectable time of thirty-two days, twenty two hours in a thirty-five footer.

The next singlehanded transatlantic race is not scheduled until 1976 but if the trend continues some amazing boats will be entered.

SOME MID-SUMMER THOUGHTS--A GUEST EDITORIAL

#### - Bob Bruce -

Within the past few months the American Topical Association has published the results of its biennial poll on the relative popularity of various topical collecting fields. Although based only on the preferences of ATA's members (thus missing a fair sampling in fine arts and sports, where independent organizations function), it is probably a reasonably accurate survey of topical collecting interests in the United States. In the current poll, sports, always within the top ten, moved upward from seventh to fourth.

Commenting upon the poll and specifically on sports collecting, Stan Showalter subsequently offered the following comments in his investment column in a recent issue of <u>Linn's Stamp News</u>:

"Sports moves up from seventh to fourth place. I believe this is one of the most solid topicals you can put your money into.

"While we may see some fluctuation in sports stamps' popularity over the years, there is little doubt in my mind that this one will always be with us, and I recommend it for those who wish to buy and hold for a longer period." (Quoted with permission of Linn's Stamp News)

Accepting this statement as a good justification for sports collecting beyond sheer enjoyment, I raise questions in two areas of our organization's program:

- l. What do our members want? Are they satisfied with the present program, including our periodical? It would appear so for we hear relatively little from the membership. Yet the sales department languishes, with virtually no buyers and even fewer sellers. Editor John La Porta would welcome comments, either positive or negative, on the contents of our <u>Journal of Sports Philately</u>. We know our members exist; they pay their dues and presumably receive their periodicals, but nothing else happens.
- 2. Can we not have more active participation by more of our members? In the fourteen years since Sports Philatelists International began as a Sports Unit of the ATA the officers and directors have

faced constantly one hard fact -- only a small group of dedicated workers keeps the organization viable.

How can members help? A number of suggestions come to mind easily. The sales department is a good thing; I have cleaned out most of my duplicates in this way and buyers, especially newer sports collectors, would do well to contact Arlo Scoggin since he is prepared offer personalized assistance. Another good auction is coming up soon; choice material from the collection of the late Irwin Bloomfield will make up the bulk of the catalogue. A group of bicycle collectors, mostly inexperienced in topical philately. is crying for leadership.

The list goes on. Editor La Porta would be delighted to have a back-log of material awaiting publication rather than to have to scrounge beyond the range of regular contributors. But most of all, a few volunteers to enlarge that small group who continue their "labor of love" would be appreciated. Every member has some talents which can be put to use.

In a few weeks another slate of officers and directors will take Already one or two major improvements are planned. over the helm. But from considerable intimate experience over those fourteen years I know the frustration they will experience unless things change considerably. How about you and you and you; will you help? Write to our new president or one of the directors and offer your comments and your cooperation: we shall need you. Don't just sit there: cate!

I acquired this red-orange label inscribed "Spartakiade" and dated "Juli 1931 Berlin." at bottom reads: "Rote Sport Internationale." It shows an athlete standing abreast of Russia swinging a hammerball inscribed "RSI." Cringing fearfully along the edge of the globe are a number of figures. One directly under the hammerball appears to be a man in the Nazi Brownshirt uniform. There is a corpulent man with a top hat (caricature of a capitalist?). There is one person holding a white cross. At the extreme right on the label is helmeted soldier with a sword on all fours. Between the athlete's legs appear to be two cannon.

History tells us that Berlin in 1931 was a hotbed of Communists and Hitler's Brownshirts were continually fighting them. Hitler took control of the German government in 1933 and ousted the Communists.
