

## Hockey on Stamps

1. 1951 Japan (Scott 550) 6th National Athletic Meet, 2 Yen Blue/grey.

The first country to issue a hockey stamp was Japan in 1951 on the occasion of the 6th National Athletic Meeting at Hiroshima. Hockey was introduced to Japan by an Irishman, the Rev. Canon William Grey, who joined the St. Andrew's Community Mission in Toyko and in 1905 started hockey at Keio University. Japan entered the Olympic Games hockey tournament at Los Angeles in 1932 beating the host nation, the USA 9-2 and suffering a 11-1 defeat by the only other competitor, India.

Hockey is now a major sport at Japanese universities and as a result of vigorous international competition, Japan now ranks highly among the hockey nations of the world.

2. 1956 Netherlands (Scott B299) 16th Olympic Games, Melbourne. 10¢ + 5¢ black/grey.

Holland was, in 1956, the first European country to feature hockey on a stamp in their Olympic Games semi-postal set. This striking 10¢ stamp (the 5¢ premium went to swell the Dutch Olympic Committee's funds) is of more than ordinary interest as it will be recalled that the Dutch withdrew from the Melbourne Games as a protest against the Russian occupation of Hungary - an ironic gesture as both the USSR and Hungary competed, the former heading the list of medal winners (98) and the latter sharing the fourth position with Germany (each 26)!

There is also mild controversy as to whether this is an ice-hockey stamp. Claims that the Dutch postal authority label it an ice-hockey issue have appeared in print but despite the semi-stylized body it is doubtful that this was the artist's intention! The complete absence of skates and the shape of the stick and ball convincingly refute any claims to ice-hockey. Stamp designers invariably depict the ice-hockey puck as an ellipse and of course there is no mistaking the ice-

hockey stick. For comparison see photographs C1, C2 and, especially, the very similar C3.

Hockey was introduced to the Netherlands in 1891 by W. "Pim" Mullier who had played it during a stay in England but it wasn't until 1928 that the International Rules were finally adopted as a prerequisite for participation in the Olympic Games. Before this a large ball ("sinasappel") was used and play with both faces of the stick was permitted. Today Holland ranks second only to West Germany in European hockey competition.





3. 1958 Dominican Republic (Scott C107) Olympic Games - Indian Team 16¢ air mail. Blue, orange and green.

In 1958 the Dominican Republic was the first country to print a hockey stamp after it became fashionable to flood the market with issues aimed at the sports philatelists. It is not known to what extent hockey is played in this country -- if at all! This air mail stamp professes to depict a scene from the Melbourne Olympic Games hockey final, India beating Pakistan 1 - 0, but India's opponents in this illustration certainly are not the green-shirted Pakistanis! The stamp overprinted in April 1959 for the International Geophysical Year.

4. 1960 San Marino (Scott 462) Olympic Games "Roma 1960" 15 L violet and green.

In 1960 San Marino brought out an attractive stamp to mark the Rome Olympic Games. Here again the target was the sports philatelist as the Republic of San Marino quite possibly makes no pretensions about possessing any hockey fields! The only blemishes on this stamp are the oversize ball and the illegally sharp toe of the stick.

5. 1962 Indonesia (Scott 567) 4th Asian Games, Djakarta 4r50 green & red.

Issued in 1962 to commemorate the fourth Asian Games in Djakarta where the furore over the exclusion of Taiwan and Israel nearly caused the withdrawal of India. This bold green and red stamp's charm lies in its simplicity. It is however difficult to see how the designer justified the awkward and unnecessary stance of the figure in the background while the ball can also be faulted for color and size.

6. 1962 Macau (Scott 394) Hockey, 10 Avos multicolored.

In 1962, with an eye mainly on philatelic revenue, the Portuguese authorities issued sets of six multicolored sports designs for each of their overseas provinces. The Macau hockey stamp is remarkable for its heavy stick with a generous blade, probably essential for propelling the somewhat oversize ball. It is amusing to note that one stamp

catalog (Brun) captioned a photograph of this stamp as "Golf".

7. 1962 Pakistan (Scott 163) Hockey - "Sports Developement Program".  
13 Paisa black and green.

One of the giants in world hockey, Pakistan, issued a set of symbolic stamps in August 1962 as publicity for its National Sports Development program. Since partition from India in 1947 Pakistan's record international hockey is an impressive one. At the London Olympic Games and at Helsinki, Great Britain and the Netherlands followed India in the final ranking list - forcing Pakistan into fourth place. However since then Pakistan has contested every Olympic final. They lost to India in Melbourne and Tokyo, beat India in Rome and Australia in Mexico City and are recognized as the current world champions. In the three Asian Games hockey tournaments held to date they emerged winners against India in 1958 and 1962 but lost to India in 1966.

8. 1962 Pakistan (Scott 168) Sports Equipment - "International Industries Fair". 13 Paisa black and green.

In November 1962 Pakistan issued a set of stamps in connection with the Pakistan International Industries Fair and hockey made a somewhat obscure appearance on the 13 Paisa "Sports Equipment" denomination. On the right-hand side, between the tennis and squash racquets, can be seen the handle of a hockey stick while a hockey ball lies in front of the squash racquet.

9. 1963 Japan (Scott B26) Olympic Games Tokyo 1964 5 Yen + 5 Yen  
black and white.

In 1963 Japan issued, as one of its fifth-series pre-Olympic designs, what is probably the best hockey stamp produced to date. Designer H. Otsuka is either a hockey player himself or made a thorough study of the game before executing his commission, resulting in a beautiful piece of draughtsmanship in which neither the rules or the arts of hockey are offended.

10. East Germany (Scott B107) Hockey - Kate Tucholla. Concentration Camps Memorial Fund, Sportsmen Victims, 2nd series. 10 pf + 10 pf  
green and black.

East Germany issued in September 1963, a stamp that has two noteworthy features. It is the only philatelic recognition so far of women's hockey and it is the only stamp to depict a player individually in her own right. Kate Tucholla was one of many socialist victims of Nazi concentration camps. These stamps were sold in se-tenant pairs to raise funds for a memorial to the "Murnered Anti-fascist Sportsmen".



- BRAZIL August 5, 1974. World Soccer Cup. .40, Crowd at Games and Brazilian Flag. Designed by Martha Poppe.
- CANADA September 23, 1974. Montreal Olympics and Keeping Fit. 4 8¢ stamps: Snowshoeing; Skiing; Ice Skating; Curling. They all contain the hidden image of the Olympic Emblem. Designed by Hunter Stroker Templeton, Ltd. of Toronto. Printed by the Canadian Bank Note Co. in a quantity of 60 million.
- COLOMBIA August 5, 1974. World Swimming Championship. 4.50, symbolic swimmer. Design by Aurelio Ramirez. Printed in lithograph by de la Rue in a quantity of 1 million.
- IRELAND September 9, 1974. 100th Anniversary of the Irish Rugby Union. 3½p, 12p Rugby players. Printed in photogravure by Harrison & Sons. The engraving was done by Czeslaw Slania. Quantity: 3½p, 12 million, 12p, 2 million.
- PARAGUAY July 13, 1974. World Soccer Cup. 4gs, Soccer player; 5gs, Soccer ball; 10gs, Symbolic field and player.
- PERSIA August 1, 1974. 7th Asian Games, Tehran. 2R, Soccer; 2R, Shooting; 2R, Cycling; 2R, Fencing.
- RUSSIA June 12, 1974. XIII All Union School Childrens Athletic Games. 4kp, Runners. Designed by Yuri Levinovsky.
- RUSSIA August 7, 1974. World Pentathlon Championship, Moscow. 16k, Athletes in 5 events. Designed by E. Anishkin.
- SOMALIA August 1, 1974. .50, Hurdler; 1.00, Runner; 1.40, Volleyball. Designed by Murad C. Mubarak and printed by Poligraph Institute, Rome. 150,000 copies of the low value were printed and 100,000 of the 2 high values.

Acting quickly, we drew up the incorporation papers and as of Oct. 30, 1974, the State of Ill. granted the SPI the status of a General Not For Profit Corporation.


RESEARCH STUDY GROUPS --(Con't.)
