

A CONVERSATION WITH LANCE WYMAN

I recently acquired, for my Olympic philatelic collection, two sheets of design sketches used in the preparation of the Oct. 12, 1968 Olympic postage stamp issue of Mexico. Having previously met stamp designer Lance Wyman, I contacted him to arrange a time when I could discuss the sketches.



The following article concerns the conference when the circumstances in producing the issue were discussed. As philatelic collectors our concerns are usually with the end product--the stamp. However, the process of creating the issue proved so interesting I felt the information would be of value to other sports stamp collectors.

My first inquiry concerned Wyman's commission for the Mexican Olympic issue (previous to the Oct. 12th set he designed two Olympic issues.) As a young American graphic artist Wyman was originally invited, during the fall of 1966, to design the logotype for the 19th Olympiad. He remained in Mexico to become Director of Graphics for the Mexican Organizing Committee. Coincidental to this duty Emilio Obregon, Director of New Issues for the Mexican Postal Authorities, approached Wyman and suggested he submit sketches for postage stamps. "This invitation," stated Wyman, "was not part of my responsibilities as Director of Graphics."

The sheet of nine sketches pictures an early representation of seven of the nine designs adapted for the issue. Thumbnail sketches may be compared to thinking with a pencil, or in this case a felt tipped marker, on paper. "but more important," stated Wyman, "the series shows a coordination, or bringing together, of the themes and images on a single sheet which would be developed at a later date." The early developmental stage of this sheet is indicated not only by the roughness of the drawings but by the arbitrary positions of the logo's "Mexico-68" above and below the stamp illustrations. To the left of Discus Thrower sketch five, Wyman's arrow indicates his change of mind concerning the placement of the logo. At this primary stage of development he was more interested in the illustrative ideas than the placement of the logos and numerical values. This is further illustrated by the arbitrary 80 Centavo values in sketches one, two and four.

Drawing eight of the Olympic Stadium bears a Twenty Centavo value which, in the final stamp form, was changed to Forty Centavos.

The design in sketch nine of the Olympic Swimming Pool was later eliminated from the series. Another rejected idea is sketch six, a hand holding the Olympic Torch. Wyman's favorite idea, The Olympic Flame and Pyramid of the Sun at Teotihuacan stamp, originally designed for this series, replaced the Olympic Torch sketch. It was released




Oct. 6, 1968 to commemorate the arrival of the Olympic Torch at Veracruz.

The artist recalled he had a completely free hand for both the illustrative subjects and the design's value determinations.

Sketches three and four picture the symbols for the Sports and Cultural Events later developed for the Five Peso stamps. These symbols were previously designed by Wyman as Director of the Graphics Department.

While the sportive symbols are rather easy to distinguish the cultural symbols, here illustrated, represents the twenty event artistic and cultural program held in connection with the 19th Olympiad.

To accommodate the numerous Cultural and Sports symbols the embryonic rectangular sketches were changed to square shapes. When questioned about the choice of color for the Cultural symbol stamp Wyman replied, "the silver-inked Cultural stamp provided a contrast to the brilliantly colored companion Sports symbol stamp."

The finished plates adapted from sketch two - The Sports Palace, sketch 5 - the Discus Thrower, sketch seven - the Olympic Medal, and sketch eight - The Stadium were prepared using photographic models as reference. These over-sized color-separated finished plates were photographed, printed and then reduced down to stamp size. A new five-color lithographic press was then used to print the stamps which, in sheet form, appeared as miniatute symphonies of colors.

An outstanding feature of the issue evolved from the Graphic Symbol "Mexico-'68", pictured on the Ten Peso stamp. "We wanted something that would clearly relate the Olympic Games to Mexico. One way of doing this would be to use a recognizable element such as the Aztec calander or typical art forms. I felt that such elements should perhaps influence the character of the Logotype, but should not be its final literate form." Wyman said.

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
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

The dominant characteristic of the logo was inspired by similar patterns and shapes found in Mexican Art, both ancient and new. Wyman's inspiration was based on a pre-Columbian bas-relief stamp motif and a recent Huichol Indian wool design which both utilized the spiral geometry of parallel lines. Lance Wyman created a parallel-lined alphabet. In Wyman's own words, "Because the logotype "Mexico '68" is based on geometry, I've tried to capitalize on this fact. Allowing the parallel lines to generate outward achieves a radiating effect which expresses

an outward flow of waves, which I hope suggests communications." He continued, "the five Olympic rings would, of course, have to be incorporated. As it worked out, the geometry of these rings enabled me to develop a 'six' and 'eight'." The logotype on the Ten Peso stamp was also the official poster for the Games; now in New York's Museum of Modern Art.

When adapted for the stamp the logo presented a problem. Originally Wyman wanted the radiating lines to 'bleed off' the edges of the stamp, as was the lower values. However, such a borderless stamp presented a problem in multiplicity. An analysis of the radiating design reveals an inversion of the radiating lines beneath the "Mexico-'68". When printed in sheet form how would the radiating lines of one stamp register with the radiating lines above and below the other stamps? The importance of the problematic block design lies in an attempt to solve the problem of the radiating lines coming together in a block of four. In its final form the stamp is surrounded by a border.


