








My good friend in Italy, Col. Carlo Condarelli, has written an excellant hand-book 'L'ARCO' (archery).

While only 68 pages and the usual format size $6\frac{1}{2}$ x $9\frac{1}{2}$ "; and soft covered, this book is well printed and better illustrated than many of the handbooks coming out of Italy that I have seen in the past few years.

The bow and arrow is well covered in its many uses as a hunting weapon, symbol, sports discipline; war weapon, etc. You sports purist can easily pick out your items as the book gives both the Scott and Yvert-Tellier numbers.

The handbook is divided into 3 sections--stamps; special cancellations and postal stationery. First day cancellations are shown only if they have a thematic relationship with either the bow or archery. The majority of the illustrations are a trifle smaller than the originals. THE OLYMPIC GAMES OF ATHENS 1896. by The Baron de Coubertin, et al.. Translation of the 1966 work originally printed in 1896 in Athens and Paris. 156 pages plus 12 pages of photograph plates. Soft cover. Page size 9 x 13". Printed in 3 sections: Greek, French and English, each approximately 50 pages. On heavy paper in large easy-to-read print. Obtainable for US \$10.00 (including airmail book rate postage) from the Hellenic Olympic Committee, 4 Kapsali St., Athens 138, Greece.

This book is apparently a reprint of the official report on the first modern Olympiad. The first two chapters discuss the events resulting in the organization of the Olympic Games at Athens, 1896. One chapter discusses the history and reconstruction of the Panathenian Stadium. The rest of the book is devoted to a daily accounting of the events including names of winners. Everything is written in the present tense which conveys a feeling of everything happening now. The different designs of the 1896 commemorative postage stamps are included in the photo plates.

Olympic enthusiasts will find this a new dimension of pleasure from this book which describes the organization and events of the First Olympic Games. Worthwhile and recommended. Sherwin Podolsky, Associate Editor.

SIEGER & THE OLYMPIC LITERATURE - When it comes to printing, and for that matter writing various philatelic handbooks and catalogues; it seems to me that we here in the U.S.A. could learn a bit from the European collectors and publishers.

Not only are the usual foreign handbooks and catalogues printed on better paper stock with clearer illustrations and photographs, but over the years I have found them to be more techically complete (are you listening Scott Publishing Cc. with your "For the Record"), and most important, one heck of a lot less costly.

To illustrate these points one has but to examine the 3 volumes of Olympic Games catalogues published over the years by Hermann E. Sieger, the well known German philatelic publisher and dealer.

If one will take the time to check thru and study these 3 fine volumes of Olympic literature, they will find one of the more complete Olympic catalogues in print today. It is a known fact that Sieger works very closely with the Michel

catalogue people whenever he produces one of his catalogues. Incidentily, Sieger also publishes an excellant catalogue on World Cup Soccer.

Volume 1 covers the Games from 1896 thru 1964; volume 2 covers 1968 and volume 3 covers 1972. Volume 3 is at presently being revised to include the later issues for the 1972 Games and Sieger is also preparing another catalogue for the 1976 Games.

With these current 3 volumes which sell for approximately 5 German marks each (postpaid); one has the nucleus of a good Olympic library. For those interested, Sieger may be contacted at the following address: Postfach 1160, 7073 Lorch/Wurttbg, Germany. Joe Schirmer, Associate, Editor.

CZECHOSLOVAKIAN SPORTS CANCELLATION - Recently, Jan Hruby, the well known Czechoslovakian collector and a long time friend, sent me a copy of the Czechoslovakian sports cancellation catalogue written by one Vaclav Nebesky.

This catalogue is bound and in the 6 x 9" format, covers the various sport cancellations during the years 1919 - 1969.

All the major sports, skiing, gymnastics, physical culture, soccer, etc. are covered. The illustrations are very clear and the descriptive matter is well done with no details omitted. Incidentily, this catalogue is divided into the international decimal system according to the individual sport.

I think that any sports collector, especially those like myself who collect the various cancellations will find this catalogue a big help in working with Czech material. ARGENTINA COINS HONORS SOCCER CHAMPIONSHIP

The final round of the 1978 World Soccer Cup will be held in Argentina. As hosts, the Argentines will shatter many traditions. For the first time in history, a set of coins will be issued marking the games. The Central Bank of Argentina will issue a set of six legal tender coins ranging in value from 20 to 3,000 pesos. The three smaller denominations -20, 50 & 100 pesos-will be struck in a copperaluminum-nickel alloy. The three larger denominations-1,000, 2,000 & 3,000 pesos-will be struck in coin silver (.900). Sets will be issued this year (1977) and in 1978, too. Each coin design depicts a different point of game interest.

In addition to being the first such coins in numismatic history, they are also the first silver coins issued by Argentina in 93 years.

The Buenos Aires mint will strike the three minor denominations, the Santiago mint the balance. A total of 1.5 million will be struck for circulation, but in 1978 the amount will be raised to 2 million. Proof sets will be available this year, but only of the silver issues. No proofs of minor denominations will be available.

The foreign exchange firm of Manfra, Tordella and Br ookes, 30 Rockefeller Plaza, New York, NY 10020, will be the exclusive worldwide distributors of the 1978 official commemorative issue. Sets will cost \$36, plus \$3 shipping, insurance and handling charges. Collectors should write first for full ordering information. Review by Ed Rochette, reprinted from the Chicago Sun-Times.

There's no better "World Cup" Material than that issued by the host country. Let us take a look at what is available from Argentina, up-to-date, in stamps and related (documentary) material.

Arlo Scoggin, SPI's able sales circuit manager, obtained answers to the questions raised in my article in the September-October, 1977 issue of 1977. He forwarded the article to Walter E. Norton of the Lithuanian Philatelic Society of New York. Here are Mr. Norton's answers.

Our hero who wrote the card is Leo Macionis, an American born citizen who was a contestant in the Lithuanian National Olympics which is commemorated by the postcard. Mr. Macionis attended Yale University and set records on the swimming team. The Lithuanian Olympics were open to all Lithuanians residing at home or abroad—as long as they were of Lithuanian parentage.

A translation of the inscription on the picture side of the postcard is "First

Lithuanian National Olympic Participation".

Leo was of college age at the time of the games and now resides in Philadelphia and is in the insurance business. As a contestant in the games, he set new records in the swimming events.

Events held included track, boxing, weightlifting, basketball, soccer, handball, swimming, water polo, tennis, ping pong, shooting, equestrian sports, aeroplane events, yachting, boat racing, cycling and national dances. Events were held at various locations in Kaunas and around Lithuania. The equestrian sports were held at the hippodrome in Kleboniskis. Air events were held at the Kaunas aerodrome, and probably consisted of gliding. Yachting, boat racing and cycling events were held at Klaipeda.

There is a strong demand for quality philatelic items related to the earlier Olympics. Unforunately, auctions devoted to topicals rarely happen nowsadays and one must watch for catalogs dealing with countries involved in past Olympiads and quality postal history. Most catalogs have very few Olympic lots which must be carefully sought out. This is actually part of the challenge of the chase. Straight country collectors have no problem finding suitable auction catalogs. Topical collectors have a much more difficult time.

Henri Trachtenberg reports that the complete set of blocks of 4 with gutter between of the France 1924 Olympic stamps realized about 2200 DM (US \$1,034) in Germany.

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New Issue Column

EDITOR'S NOTE: DJIBOUTI REPUBLIC is the former French Territory of Afars & Issas. This new Republic came into being on June 27, 1977. SPANISH SAHARA issued stamps between 1924 & Nov. 1975. At this time Spain divided the area between Morocco and Mauritania to avoid a colonial war. However, Algeria also made claim to this land. As of this moment, there is conflict between Algeria (financed by Libya and supplied by Russia) and the people of Morocco and Mauritania. Therefore, Scott catalog is not listing the Spanish Sahara issues until some form of territorial settlement is made. Your editor will keep you abreast of further developments.

ALGERIA - 9-24-77 Third African Athletic Events .60 \$ 1.40 da showing ribbons and Olympic Rings.

ARGENTINA - 10-8-77 4-30p stamps honoring tourist area. One showing skiers and the skiing area of Chapell of San Martin de los Andres-Neuquen. Printed by the National Mint, quantity 2 million, offset.

BOLIVIA - 1977 VII Bolivarian Games. Flags and athletes.

BOTSWANA - 8-22-77 Scott 191 25t Ancient MORABARABA board. Designer: M.F. Bryan, printer: John Waddington, lithography in panes of 50. Also a S/S containing all 6 stamps of the set. Editor's Note: the first 3 SPI members who give me the correct answer to what a MORABARABA Board is, will receive a philatelic gift.

CHAD - Oct. 24, 1977 Sports 30fr runners; 60fr volleyball; 120fr football; 125fr basketball. Designer: J. Combet. Recess printed by the French Stamp Printing Office.

CHAD - Nov. 25, 1977 World Football Cup. 5 stamps & souvenir sheet. CENTRAL AFRICAN EMPIRE - Nov. 18, 1977. World Football Cup. 5 stamps and a souvenir sheet.

CUBA - Sept. 9, 1977. Military Spartakiad Games 1¢ boxing; 3¢ handball; 5¢ parachuting; 10¢ running; 13¢ gredade throwing; 30b rifle shooting. Designer R. Quintana, offset printed by Post Office Dept. Havana in a quantity of 595,000. NOTE: US laws forbit the importing, selling and trading of these stamps. A-43 The symbolic design pictured on the Indonesian set issued Oct. 15, 1951, B63-67, shows the emblem of the games: the wings of the holy bird Garuda surrounding a lotus flower-the symbol of purity-and the flame-the symbol of fighting spirit.

A-46 Carl-Olof Enhagen's book "Sport Stamps" also provides the following information about the French stamp #845, issued Aug. 31, 1957 to commemorate the International University Games, Paris Aug. 31 to Sept. I, 1957 picturing Leo Lagrange. Lagrange was the French Minister for Sport between 1936 and 1940 and was killed during the war. Pictured on the background of the lilac gray and black stamp is the stadium of Charlety, outside of Paris.

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
