Pictorial cancels can be applied for by the Swedish Post Office. Because of the great number of applications of non-philatelic clubs and events today have to pay a fee. During the second half of 1980, the following pictorial sport cance is were used by the Swedish Post Office.

June 25 and 27. Uddevalla P.O. Motif: handballplayer. The gymnastic club Kroppskultur arranged the youth tournament Sweden Open (outdoor handball) in Uddevalla.

July 13. Amal P.O. Motif: an old Model Ford. A veteran car rally in the north of the district of Dalsland with start and finish in Amal. Arranged by the regional preservation club and others.

July 17-20. Bastad P.O. Motif: racket and ball with water as background. The tennis tournament Swedish Open in Bastad arranged by Bastad tennis.

July 13. Gavle P.O. Motif: anchor and the letters GSS. Gefle Segalsall-skap (GSS) celebrated her 100-anniversary with a sail regatta.

July 21. Boras P.O. Motif; an athlete lifting a winged wheel and a knight. USIC (Union Sportive Internationale des Cheminots) chess championship at the Grand Hotel in Boras. Arranger; Swedish Railwaymen Leisure Association.













July 21-24. Bandhagen P.O. Motif: Ys Men's Clubs badge and a sailboat in front of Cith Hall in Stockholm. Y's Men International Convention held at Stockholm Fair in Alvsjo.

July 21-25. 5 day contest in orienteering in the district of Uppland. The contest is an annual affair but in different locations and called O-ringen. Uppsala P.O.

July 25-28. Karlskrona P.O. Motif: trainingship Gladan of the Swedish Navy. Karlskrona is stage destination in a race within Sail Training Race, which starts outside Keil, Germany, and is called Sail Karlskrona.

August 23. Hallsberg P.O. Motif: a car from the club badge. One of the races in the Swedish rally championship arranged by Hallsberg Motor Club (HMK).













August 30. Kar lskrona P.O. Motif: badge of arranging club. Swedish outdoor championship for crippled in boccie. Arranged by Karlskrona Handikappidrottsforening (Karlskrona Sport Club for Crippled).

August 13-14. Skene P.O. Motif club badge of arranger. A market Skene Marten arranged by Skene Idrottsforening (Skene Sports Club).

October 24-26. Ljusdal P.O. Motif: bandysticks and the gkgo of the games. A bandy tournament Dex World Cup, played day and night, arranged by the community of Ljusdal and the Ljusdal Bandy Club. Bandy is something similar to field hockey but played on ice. At national level it is only played in Sweden, Norway, Finland and the USSR.

Novenber 27-30. Karlskrona P.O. Motif: table tennis racket with laurel sprays. Scandinavian Open Championships (SOC) in table tennis. Arranged by Lyckeby Bordtennisklubb (Lyckeby Table Tennis Club) in Karlskrona.







August 7-10. Motif: swim stadium in Skovde. European Junior Championships in swimming and diving. Arranged by Skovde Simsallskap (Skovde swimming society).

August 8. Sandviken P.O. Motif: the emblem of the 70-iad. National finals of the 70-iad. A youth sports tournament.

# Figure Sports Philately

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### THE EUROPEAN ATHLETIC CHAMPIONSHIPS

The European Athletic Championships are the world's largest organized athletic championship competition after the Olympic games, and the most outstanding one in Europe.

Competition is held every fourth year, specifically in the year between those in which two Olympic games are held. This institution got its start in 1934 with the 1st European Athletic Championship Track Meet in Turin. In continuation, organized competition was held in Paris and Vienna (women's games) in 1938, Oslo (1946), Brussels (1950), Bern (1954), Stockholm (1958), Belgrade (1962), Budapest (1966), Athens (1969), Helsinki (1971), Rome (1974), and Prague (1978). In 1982 it will be held in Athens at the newlyconstructed Olympic Stadium in Kalogreza. Greece is the only country ever to have taken on twice the organization of these top-flight classic athletic competitions. With the issuance of the two stamps in the set of 1981, the institution's ideas are set forth, on the one hand by the new stadium, and on the other in the symbolic representation of all of Europe (32 countries with more than 1500 competitors and 1400 members of the press and media representatives) gathering in Athens. \*

### LETS POOL OUR OLYMPIC AND SPORTS KNOWLEDGE

Sports and Olympic philatelists have, collectively, a great deal of knowledge, which when pooled, can be of mutual benefit. A - 75 Perhaps the 1956 Stockholm Olympic Equestrian trilingual souvenir post card that you are referring to is one picturing a photograph of an ecuestrian rider which features the following Swedish green imprinted text, "Ecuestrian Games of the XVI Olympiad/ Stadion 10-1 7/6 1956 STOCKHOLM". Over printing this text is a repetition of the five Olympic rings which give the appearance that the equestrian is riding on Olympic ground. Beneath this pictured cachet is the same green inprinted text in French and English.

Although it is difficult to identify the rider in the cachet there is a photograph on Page 105 of "The Olympic Games", edited by Lord Killanin and John Rodda of Capt. C.F. Pahud de Mortanges -four time gold medalist of the Netherlands- who appears to wear the same uniform as in the equestion cachet on the post card. The photograph, in the book, also picturing in the background a Nazi flag, identifies the 17 year old mount Marcroix which de Mortanges rode during the XI Berlin Olympics.

A Green imprinted Olympiad-Brevkort in your editom collection has both the "Stockholm Ryttarlavlingar XVI Olympiadens June 10.1956" (opening day) cancel tying the 20 Ore coil value and the June 17,1956 (closing day) circular handstamps. Also applied to the card are two double ring cacheted handstamps with the following three straight-lined text. "Stadium Opening Day" in purple in one handstamp, and "Stadium Closing Day" in green, in the other handstamp. Circling between the double rings on both cacheted handstamps are the words: "In presence of H.M.Queen Elizabeth II and H.M.King Gustaf VI Adolf". Imprinted in black is the following address: Herr Sven Larsson, Box 29, Stockholm 1 However, there is a penciled cross over the address and the city Kappsla is substituted.

Your editor has seen the same cards in the Dave Bressler collection with the green Stadium Opening Day double ring cachet and normal June 10 1956 handstamp on one card and the violet Stadium Closing Day and June 17 1956 handstamp on the other.


