THE "LOS ANGELES OLYMPICS 1984" METERS

This article discusses only the meters used at the Olympic venues during the XXIIIrd Olympiad. Outside the scope of this article are meters used by sponsors, foreign organizations and the International Olympic Committee in Switzerland. The meters used by the los Angeles Olympic Committee will be subject of a separate article.

The meters under discussion are those used by the United States Postal Service (USPS) at various dates from July 14 through August 15,1984. All the meter machines were Pitney Bowes and made red impressions directly on a tape which was affixed to a cover or sometimes sold as a dry tape.

The use of a commemorative meter at the postal stations at the Olympic venues was a major surprise to philatelists who were caught unprepared. Advance announcement of black pictorial cancellations had been made in the philatelic press. Inquiries about commemorative postal labels for registry, insured mail, special delivery and certified mail disclosed nothing special was planned.

The special meter tape bears the words "LOS ANGELES OLYMPICS 1984" in the dial portion. Because every meter machine has its own number, it became apparent that every venue provided its own variant of the meter type.

It is important to understand the USPS operations at each venue. The two types of black pictorial venue cancellations were available at one or more outdoor tables. No other cancellations were normally available at these outdoor tables. The only other cancellation possible was the double ring registry-type cancel applied also by hand. Sometimes the double ring was applied in red, sometimes in black. The outdoor tables were usually canopied, but the public was not protected from the hot sun.

The discovery of the Olympic meter was made at OLYMPHILEX '84 at the Pasadena Convention Center, Pasadena on opening Day, July 25, 1984. The idea of making meters available was the idea of Al Nesland of the USPS Olympic Program headquartered in Long Beach, California. The purpose of the meters was primarily to assist the athletes in sending things home.


The OLYMPHILEX '84 postal booths were inside one of the two exhibition rooms. The black venue cancels were supplied at a separate table. At the three service counters, there were sales of the Olympic stamps, the Babe Ruth .20 stamps, the Jim Thorpe .20 stamps and the Golden Moments book priced at \$20. One of the three service counters had access to the meter machine.

On July 25, 1984, some 30 meters were released with an error or date reading "JUN 25," according to a report by the supervisor, Pat Vines. She was not in charge of the meter machine, however.


Some collectors dispute this estimate and it is probably higher. I know I obtained also ten dry tapes with the date error. Some time during the day, the error in month was recognized and corrected. However, I have no reports of the meter with correct date of "JUL 25."

Other venues had free-standing buildings or used a large mobile bus. At the Coliseum there were three building stations, each with its own meter. Usually only one clerk was allowed to use the meter. Sometimes I would go to a station (water polo, for example) and request meters for the additional postage required but was told that the meter would be applied later by the supervisor. In such cases, I asked that the double ring cancel be applied to tie the meter to the cover. Usually I would get a promise from the clerk that this would be done, but my covers arrived without the tying ring cancel.

There was no real consistency in applying the double ring cancel. Some clerks restricted its use only to special mail such as registry or special delivery. Others applied the ring cancel freely. The wording in the double ring ring is often found to be incomplete or weak. Such varying considerations should not impair its collectibility.

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
The air conditioned postal stations and buses provided comfort primarily for the postal clerks. The buses allowed no public inside. The postal stations (buildings) allowed only a few of the public inside.

The hours of availability of postal service varied considerably. At the Coliseum, although there were three postal stations, they were usually closed for one hour for lunch, but only one would be closed at one time. Also, the stations would open only a few hours before the event was scheduled to begin. In some cases, the postal station would not open until the afternoon.

The Closing Day, August 12, 1984, was the worst day. The station opened at 1 PM. There were three outdoor tables for the black venue cancels (with and without killer bars). There were two clerks at each table. The lines were each 100 feet long or longer before each clerk. The waiting time was 3 or four hours. Then, there was another wait to get into the postal station to get the meter and ring cancel--usually another hour! Conrad Klinkner waited five hours. I waited four hours. It was very hot but the crowd was orderly.


What was the public buying? They were buying the \$20 Golden Moments book, affixing the stamps in it to special pages in the book and seeking the matching cancels for the stamps. They were buying maximum cards and mailing them. When you consider there were 25 different maximum cards and any number of stamps on different pages in the book, it is easy to see why postal service could be so time-consuming. Customers would spend several minutes eyeing the different books, stamps, postal stationery and maximum cards and entertain the different ways to do their instant philately.

What were the ways to collect the special meters? Was there a best way? Let us examine the options.




#### Front

DRY TAPE. Many postal clerks refused to provide dry tape. Most insisted on affixing the tapes to letters and sending through the post. In a sense, thus, dry tapes may be compared to mint postage stamps. Of course, requests for dry tapes were made entirely by collectors.

METER TAPES AFFIXED TO COVERS WITH NO OTHER CANCELLATIONS. These are quite legitimate. This is the way most meter mail is commercially handled anyway. But this creates some problems for collectors. The actual venue is not conveniently identified by the meter. Also, the meter tape could have been originally bought dry and later affixed to a desirable envelope or postcard after the fact. Also, much US mail was not getting the usual colored postal computer markings or other transit markings. Nevertheless, it would be possible to identify the venue of the meter by its meter number and date.

METER TAPE AFFIXED TO COVERS WITH BLACK VENUE CANCEL. The black venue cancel (with or without killer bars) would usually be applied to a stamp on the cover. The meter would be for a rate to make up the balance of required postage. The meter would still not be tied. Remember that the black venue cancel could only be obtained at the special cancel tables outside. Meters had to be obtained inside the postal booth. The logical sequence seemed to be to go first to the outdoor table to get the black venue pictorial cancel applied to the stamp(s), and then go to the postal station for the meters and dispatching of mail. Sometimes there were exceptions. Some covers exist with the meter tied by the black venue cancel and this suggests a reverse procedure. This reverse procedure was risky as sometimes clerks would not cooperate. Normally the meter would not be tied by any cancel. if the reverse procedure was followed.

METER TAPE AFFIXED TO COVER. METER TAPE TIED BY DOUBLE RING CANCEL. STAMPS TIED BY BLACK VENUE CANCEL. This arrangement had the assurance that the meter was affixed on the posted date and of showing two different typs of hand cancels. However, some clerks (even at the same venue station) would not apply the ring cancel when requested. Some did not have access to the ring cancel for some reason. Some promised to apply the ring cancel later but did not follow through.

In summary, the various forms for the meters are as follows:

- a. dry meter tape
- b. meter tape affixed to cover with no other cancellations on meter or on cover
- c. meter tape affixed to cover; black venue cancel on stamp, but not on meter
- d. meter tape affixed to cover and tied by black venue cancel
- d. meter tape affixed to cover and tied by ring cancel; black venue cancel on stamp(s).

The above forms are situations possible at the venue post offices. Sometimes there are overcancels or transit markings later after dispatch. These markings may or may not tie the meter further to the cover.

Some overseas mailings have received interesting markings. Great Britain, for example, used blue dot phosphor markings across the cover. Mail for SPI member Laurentæ Jonker in Holland has arrived with a black rubberstamp reading "MISSENT TO MANILA." SPI member V. Furman of Odessa, USSR reports receiving a cover with a transit marking of Ho Chi Minh city in Wiet Nam.

Some postal supervisors made things very difficult for collectors to obtain meters. The following situations are known:

- 1. OLYMPHILEX '84. A most stubborn postal supervisor decreed a \$1.00 minimum fee for a meter. Later the meter was withdrawn from service. Collector complaints to headquarters office in Long Beach later restored service at normal fees.
- Pentathlon, July 29, 1984. Meter service was refused this day. Collector complaints restored service the next day.
- 3. The Coliseum (Athletics and Boxing venue dates). Meter service was refused at least on August 4, 1984 and possibly other dates. I was able to obtain covers with black venue cancels for Athletics and Boxing, but had to walk a half mile to the postal station at the Swimming Stadium to get meters for the balance of required postage and to mail my covers. Collector complaints restored meter service at the Coliseum later.
- 4. Equestrian, Fairbanks Country Club, July 1 at Rancho Santa Fe. This one day venue had no meter service available.

  Also, no registry, certified mail or special delivery service was available. According to Conrad Klinkner, only souvenir cancels were available.

Separately I furnish a schedule of the meters identified by meter number, event and venue and event date. Note that in some instances the same meter was used on certain dates for more than one event. This is true for the Athletics and Boxing events at the Coliseum, and for Fencing, Volleyball and Yachting events at Long Beach.

Although there were 25 different meters (by meter number) used, there are 43 possible combinations of the meter with the correct venue event cancel.

The quality of the meter impression sometimes varies. Baseball is usually only a fair impression.


Closed to the public were the Olympic venues: Olympic Villages, Press Center and Broadcast Center and their post offices. However, no meter was available at the Olympic Village at Santa Barbara. Also, no meters were used at the soccer venues at Palo Alto, Anapolis and Cambridge.

Nevertheless, a few collectors were able to visit the postal stations at the Olympic Villages at UCLA and USC, the Press Center and Broadcast Center and obtain examples for the philatelic world. How scarce are these meters? No dealers are known to have obtained meters or prepare covers with meters. Even at this date in November 1984 there has been no publicity about the Olympic meters in the US philatelic national press. The author and Conrad Klinkner compared notes and came up with a tentative consensus that the most common meter is from OLYMPHILEX '84. Klinkner feels all other meters are rare.

100 airmail postcards were prepared for an IMOS member in West Germany. These postcards have .20 Olympic stamp and .08 OLYMPHILEX '84 meter both tied by the double ring cancel. The black venue cancel was not applied. These postcards will be sold to IMOS members for 3 DM (about US\$1.00) each. This is the only "wholesale" dealer-type lot known.

The author estimates that perhaps 200 covers exist with the meter used at OLYMPHILEX '84. Of other event venues, perhaps up to 50 exist of each. These figures relate to items in collector hands. Items addressed by non-collectors and having meters are probably largely lost to the collecting philatelic public.

Despite three post offices at the Coliseum with four different event cancels, it is a challenge to complete collections of covers with combinations of the meters and black venue cancels. Such collections would amount to 12 covers and as yet no person is known to have such a collection.


The USPS issued a booklet at all postal stations at the Olympic Games: "Official U. S. Postal Service Guide to the Los Angeles 1984 Olympic Games." In French and English, the booklet provided information about rates, Olympic events, souvenir cancellations and how to obtain them, the various philatelic products, etc. Nothing is mentioned about the availability of the special meters.

The booklet also did not mention the special cancel for the International Olympic Committee at Hotel Biltmore and its Olympic meter. There was a distinctive black hand cancellation available and also the ring cancellation. I saw an IOC delegate mail a large parcel with a meter. Also, I visited the postal station at



6. One way of ensuring that the meter would be tied by a cancel was by using a crowded envelope sent special delivery. Special delivery gets an arrival cancel in the USA whereas registered mail does not. The dated special delivery cancel in purple and the black venue cancel tie the meter. Note that the meter is Type I with large "P.B." before the meter number, 959772. Water polo meter and black cancels.

Hotel Biltmore twice. The first time, August 1, I believe, found no postal service available as the clerk was sick. I do not know if a replacement clerk was available later that day. Also, I learned that the postal station was closed on July 29 because the IOC did not meet that day. I had wanted to get covers with the black cancel posted that particular date but received a phone call from Florence Villasenor, a postal employee with philatelic interests, that that date was not available.

It would be interesting to try to discover the postmark dates for each meter that are known. However, this formidable task would have to wait another time.

This article would not be possible without the assistance of many persons who have tried to capture the meter aspect of the XXIIIrd Olympiad for the philatelic record. Major credit goes to Conrad Klinkner and Hugh Gottfried . Klinkner describes the the effort as costing "blood, sweat, swearing, gas, etc." Certainly the almost endless driving all over Southern California, the expense in parking fees, the long waiting lines at the postal stations, the summer heat, the unexpected delays in finding postal stations closed, the unexpected frustrations in finding meter service not available, the continual complaints to the USPS headquarters, the repeat visits in the hope to find meter service available are the true story behind almost every meter obtained.

Other persons helping to complete the meter story include Johan Jorgen Holst, Ward Nichols, Laurentz Jonker, Maurizio Tecardi, Ed Epstein, Florence Villasenor, Al Nesland, Pat Vines, Werner Simon and Tim Nagel. Bob Wilcock and Laurentz Jonker provided foreign receiving addresses for many covers that resulted in some interesting transit markings. My thanks to all who helped.





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

Bulgarian map and Moscow logo stamp diagramming the torch route through Bulgaria was issued by the Bulgarian post to commemorate the 1980 Torch Relay to Moscow. Left of the dividing line on the address side of each card is a illustration of a town landmark, the text, "Bearer of Torch To Olympic Games Through P.R. Bulgaria" and the name of the town.

The reverse side of these cards were printed with the same Bulgarian text in different colors. The following is a listing of the dates, towns and text colors:

June 25 Kipta lt.yellow-green June 25 Blagoerad lt.yellow-green June 26 Sofia lt.brown June 27 Plovdiv lt.yellow-green June 28 Shipka lt.green June 29 Veliko-Tirnova June 29 Pleven lt.brown lt.green June 30 Rousse lt.green July 1 Friendship Bridge (border) lt.brown

The following is a translation of the Bulgarian text on each card's reverse side:

"The running of the Olympic torch across Bulgaria's territory on the eve of the 22nd Olympic games in Moscow furnishes a marvelous opportunity for us to participate in their holding in the first Socialist capital in the name of peace and the triumph of sport throughout the world. We call for your participation in welcoming and greeting the Olympic torch runners passing through your places of residences."

It should also be noted that your editor has in his collection two Romanian stamped envelopes imprinted with a torch bearer 55bani stamp. As the following text (noting the Romanian towns the torch passed through) is imprinted on the left side of the envelopes it is presumed that more than two of these envelopes exist, "Traneul Flacarii Olimpice-Moscova '80/ Giurgiu-Bucuresti-Ploesti-Buzau-Focsani-Bacau-Roman-Iasi-Albita, jud. Vaslui."






