A mass gymnastics and physicultural exhibition, called Spartakiade was held in Prague, Czechoslovakia on June 28, 29 and 30, 1985. This event is always held in the huge stadium at Strahov. It is fantastic to see 13,824 performers at this years mass exercises. The stadium holds 178,000 spectators, most of which are standees. The precision movements and exercises are a breath taking spectacle.

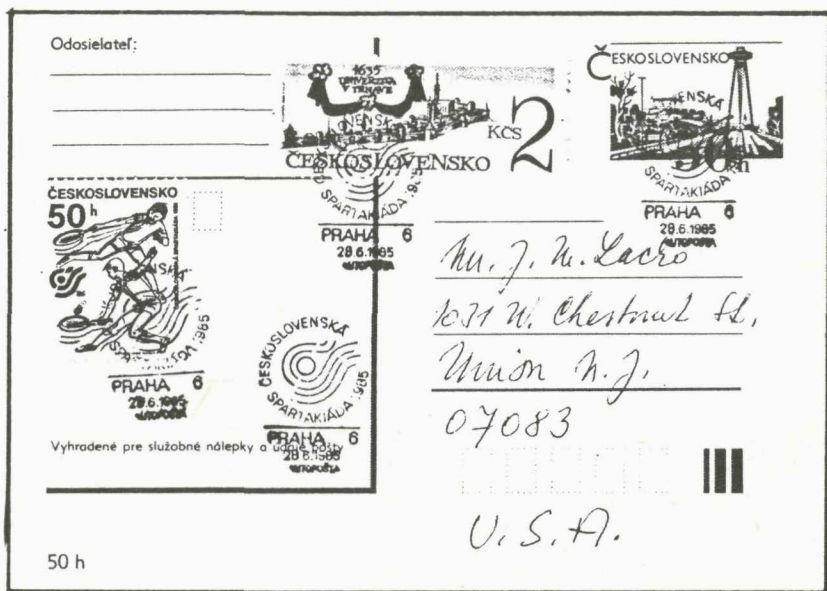
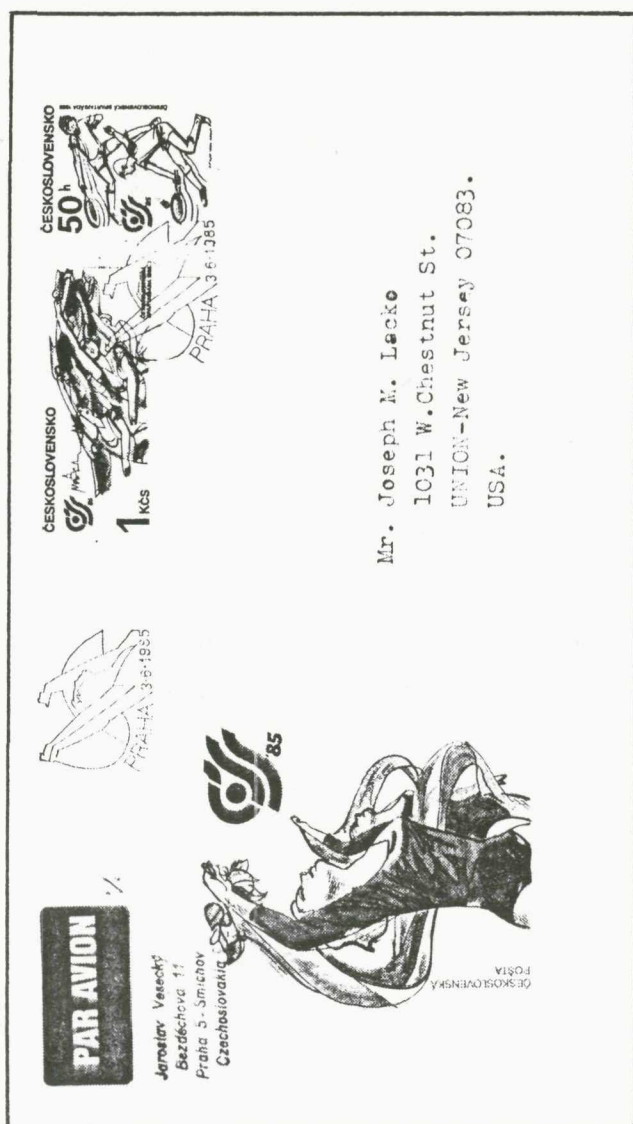

Two special cancellations were in use during the Spartakiade. The cancel is in the form of lines forming CS, which stands for Czechoslovak Spartakiade. Underneath is Prague 6, Autoposta/mobile post office and the date the event was held. Fig. 2.

The other cancel varies in post office branch number 617, mobile post office is, of course, omitted. Fig. 3.

A philatelic exhibition was held in Prague in conjunction with the Spartakiade. Two types of publicity cancels were used. One was a meter and the other a machine cancel. They translate: FROM MANIN '21 TO STRAHOV '85 PHILATELIC EXHIBITION, with logo and girl gymnast performer. The exhibition was held at Army Museum Hall. The meter is in red, Fig. 4, while the machine cancel is in black. Fig. 5.



Two booklets containing the Spartakiade stamps were available from POFIS, which is the state philatelic agency. Both sell for 5Kcs each. The number of stamps corresponds to the value of each booklet. The

covers show the stamp that is enclosed and the number and price. The rear advertises that POFIS has available ample number of stamps for sale. The 1Kcs is in blue, Fig. 6, and the 50h is in red, Fig. 7.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Should we try for Number Two? Not that we are number one in anything, but some people have been inquiring about a second edition of SPI's major publication, "Postal History and Vignettes of the 1932 Olympic Games." That book was published in 1976 and much information can be added and updated. It would be a formidable task and we would hope for a much better quality project. Necessarily, the quantity printed would be much smaller.

We could add sections on precancels, perfin, essays and die proofs. The cachet section could use a major updating and rearrangement. There are some interesting items on the cancellations, both naval and non-naval. Surprisingly, there is very little to add in the vignettes section. One diligent member is working on Olympic seals and labels and is on the verge of completing his drafts. My feeling is to leave out the 1932 vignettes from the second edition of the SPI handbook.

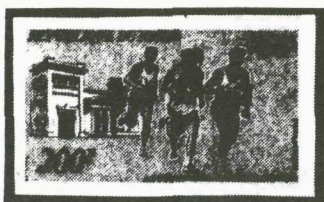
Thus, any work on the second edition will again require major cooperation by SPI members. We would like to delegate sections. One person should be responsible for one section of the revision. Who would like the cachet section? Or choose from: postal cancellations, naval covers and cancels, essays and proofs, precancels, perfin. Or perhaps you know an aspect not covered and which should be added.

Should we include prices? There was controversy about prices in the first edition. Because of so many variables, it was not possible to price everything, especially the naval items. Perhaps a scarcity table might suffice.

I am considering serving again as editor-in-chief but serving mainly as coordinator and proofreader rather than doing the bulk of the writing. John La Porta and I are discussing a better quality of paper, print quality and size, and binding. Everything right now is in the talking stage and we would need solid cooperation and commitment from several members to share the load. I invite your input.

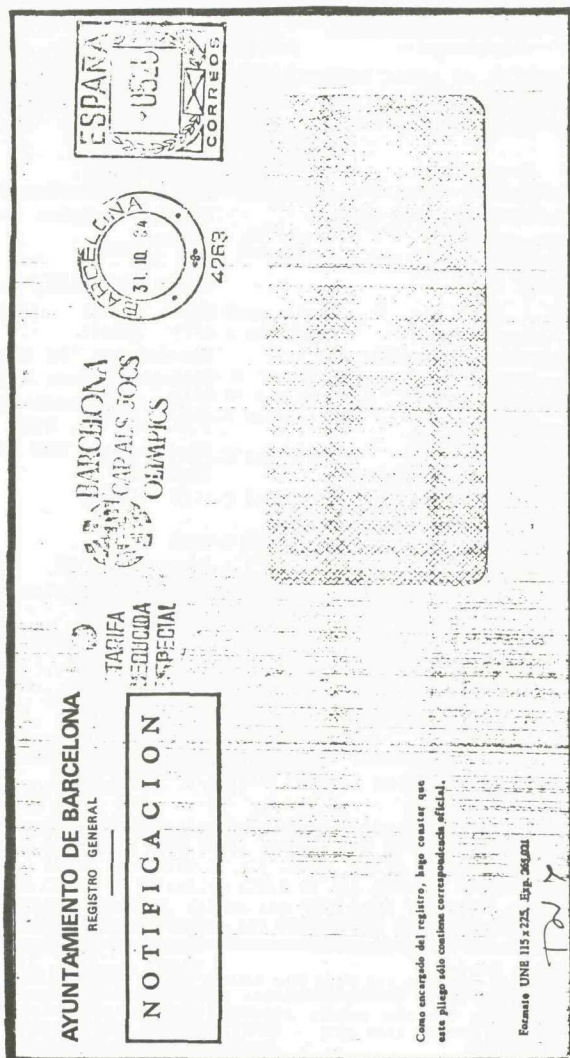
(Editor's Note by Sherwin Podolsky:

TERMS OF SALE. Please read carefully.

1. All lots are sold to the highest bidder at one bidding interval over the second highest bid. Bidding will be in \$0.50 intervals. On identical bids, the earlier postmark will govern. If only one bid is received on a lot, then the lot is sold at that bid.
2. The right is reserved to withdraw any lot prior to the sale. SPI reserves the right to reject any bid believed not to have been made in good faith. Any bid not commensurate with the value of the offering may be rejected.
3. Terms of sale are cash and successful bidders will be notified of lots purchased and must remit before lots are sent.
4. NO BUYERS PREMIUM WILL BE ADDED TO THE SALES PRICE. No charges will be made for executing bids. SPI is not responsible for bidder errors or omissions.
5. Mailing and insurance charges are payable by the purchaser. A minimum charge of \$1.00 will be made for postage, insurance, and handling. Proof of sending to the advised address shall constitute delivery.
6. Should a claim for error of description arise, such claim should be made within three days of receipt of lot. Claims made after that time cannot be considered. Lots described as collections, mixtures, etc. are not returnable under any circumstances.

A FEW WORDS FROM THE AUCTION MANAGER...

About bidding...There are always a number of tie bids. Remember that the earliest postmarked bid wins the lot, so be sure to mail your bids early. Bid the highest amount you are willing to pay for a lot. Don't overbid! If there is no other bidder, then the lot is sold at your single bid. If there are other bids, then you get the lot for just .50 over the next highest bid. Prior to the closing date, I will not release information about individual lots.

About pricing...The consignor usually sets the minimum (if any) expected for his/her material. Be realistic in pricing items you submit for auction. SPI members are knowledgeable about market values and overpriced material rarely sells. Estimates are not minimum bids, and a lot may sell for more or less than its estimated price.

About payments...Successful bidders should make payment promptly as I cannot pay consignors until all their lots are paid for. Overseas collectors should remit by draft drawn on a U.S. bank or U.S. currency (registered mail only). Do not send International Money Orders as they take a month to arrive.

About receiving auction listings quickly...Overseas members should consider paying the additional airmail postage to their membership dues so as to receive the auction listings in a more timely manner. Currently, I am allowing over two months until the closing date for bids. In my judgement, it would be unfair to expect consignors to wait longer.

About correspondence...I am happy to answer inquiries from bidders and consignors. Since postage costs are the greatest auction operating expense, I would appreciate postage for the return reply.

Thanks for your support. Interest and participation seems to be increasing, and I look forward to our auctions becoming bigger and better in the future.

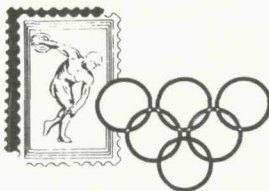

CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I--Name and Purpose

Section 1. The name of this organization shall be SPORTS PHILATELISTS INTERNATIONAL.

Section 2. The purpose of SPORTS PHILATELISTS INTERNATIONAL shall be: (1) to promote the collection and study of postage stamps and related material dealing with sports and recreation; (2) to compile and publish check-lists, handbooks, articles, membership lists and other material relating to collecting in this area; (3) to undertake such other matters as may further the objective stated previously in assisting collectors of this topic; (4) to support, insofar as possible, those organizations which sponsor and maintain amateur sports both in this country and throughout the world; and (5) to foster international understanding through interests in sports and philately.

ARTICLE II--Membership

Section 1. Membership in SPORTS PHILATELISTS INTERNATIONAL is available to collectors throughout the world upon written application to the Secretary together with the payment of annual dues.

Section 2. The membership dues shall be set by the Board of Directors in consideration of the established and planned program of the organization. Membership dues will cover the one-year period beginning with the month in which the applicant's membership is accepted by the Secretary. A member is in good standing who is not in default in the payment of dues and against whom no charges are outstanding. Any member who is sixty (60) days in arrears for annual dues shall be suspended from membership upon notification by the Secretary.

- a. Each person on the Board shall have one vote on all Board business.

Section 3. The responsibilities of membership shall be: (1) to help actively in achieving the purpose of SPORTS PHILATELISTS INTERNATIONAL; (2) to give full support to the activities of the organization; (3) to vote in all elections; and (4), if eligible and elected, to accept and hold office.

Section 4. Any member found guilty by the Board of Directors of conduct unbecoming a member shall be suspended for a period of time determined by the Board of Directors or expelled from the organization.

- a. Grounds for disciplinary action shall include, but need not be limited to, the following:

- (1) Delinquency in payment of indebtedness to the organization for a period of thirty (30) days.
- (2) Failure to answer official correspondence.
- (3) Conduct generally unbecoming a member.

b. Charges of such conduct shall be definite and specific and preferred in writing by any of the following:

(1) The Secretary-Treasurer in the case of indebtedness to the organization exceeding thirty (30) days.

(2) Any Director of the organization.

(3) Any Officer of the organization.

(4) Any member, in good standing, of the organization.

A copy of such charges and notice of the time and place of hearing (if feasible; otherwise, all charges will be handled by mail), shall be presented to the member against whom the charges are preferred, either in person or by certified or registered mail, not less than thirty(30) days prior to the date fixed by the Board of Directors for the hearing.

c. Charges against a member shall be investigated in such a manner as the Board of Directors considers appropriate. The member against whom the charges have been preferred shall have the right to file correspondence and other documents in support of his defense either in person or by mail.

Section 5. A former member may make application for reinstatement. If a member is reinstated, he may be assigned his former membership number only if he pays in full all his dues in arrears.

ARTICLE III--Officers and Directors

Section 1. The following officers shall be elected biennially: President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer may be held concurrently by the same person.

Section 2. There shall be a Board of Directors, which shall consist of all elected officers and such additional members as may be deemed necessary for the conduct of the activities of the organization. The Board of Directors shall prescribe the number of additional members.

Section 3. The President shall have general charge and supervision of the activities of the organization, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors. The President may appoint such committees as may be necessary to carry on the regular or special business of the organization. He shall appoint all other than elective officers.

Section 4. The Vice-President shall assist the President and shall perform the duties of the President in his absence or inability to serve.

Section 5. The Secretary shall keep a record of the proceedings of the organization, shall conduct correspondence as necessary and as required by the Board of Directors, shall receive all applications for membership and issue membership cards, shall keep a record of all members and submit names and addresses of new members to the Editor and Circulation Manager, shall notify members of suspension of membership privileges as appropriate, shall compile a directory of membership upon request of the Board of Directors, and shall prepare a condensed annual report of membership for submission to the Board of Directors

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and the general membership.

Section 6. The Treasurer shall keep proper records for all receipts and disbursements, shall send out annual statements for dues and collect all dues and fees, shall notify the Secretary of dues paid, and shall prepare a condensed annual report of finances of the organization for submission to the Board of Directors and the general membership.

Section 7. The Board of Directors shall be the general administrative body of the organization, controlling its policies and activities in all their details. It may conduct its business either in a session convened by the President or by mail. A majority of the members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of any business.

Section 8. Officers, committees, and members of the Board of Directors shall be reimbursed for authorized expenses.

ARTICLE IV--Elections and Meetings

Section 1. The officers and members of the Board of Directors shall be elected biennially by ballot. A majority of the ballots cast shall be required for election to office.

Section 2. A Nominating Committee, appointed by the President, shall present a slate of candidates at least thirty (30) days in advance of any election. Additional nominations may be submitted over the signature of any ten members in good standing.

Section 3. A ballot shall be provided by the Secretary for each member of the organization. All ballots submitted shall be signed and bear the full mailing address of the voting member. Only ballots received within a period of thirty days shall be counted. The elected officers and directors shall assume office on September first and shall serve until their successors are duly elected or appointed.

Section 4. Vacancies in office shall be filled: (1) in the office of President by the succession thereto of the Vice-President, and (2) in the other offices by appointment of the Board of Directors itself.

Section 5. The organization shall hold meetings at such places as selected by the Board of Directors, and announced by notification to the membership at least thirty (30) days in advance.

ARTICLE V--Official Publications

Section 1. The official publication of SPORTS PHILATELISTS INTERNATIONAL shall be called the "Journal of Sports Philately" and shall be published by the Editor and Publisher, appointed by the President and acting under the supervision of the Board of Directors.

Section 2. Any handbook or other publication prepared by the organization and offered for sale under its sponsorship shall be interpreted to be an official publication of SPORTS PHILATELISTS INTERNATIONAL.

Section 3. The Board of Directors shall have full authority in respect to the organization's publications.

ARTICLE VI--Affiliated Organizations

Section 1. The Board of Directors shall encourage the formation of affiliated organizations under such rules and conditions as the Board of Directors shall determine.

Section 2. Normally a minimum of five members of the affiliated organization shall also be members of SPORTS PHILATELISTS INTERNATIONAL. This membership requirement may be waived by the Board of Directors if deemed appropriate.

ARTICLE VII--Amendments

Section 1. Proposals for amendments to these Articles may be made: (1) by the unanimous vote of the elected officers; (2) by a majority of the Board of Directors; or (3) by a written petition signed by at least ten (10) members of the organization in good standing.

Section 2. All such proposals shall be submitted promptly to the Secretary and sent by him to all members at least thirty (30) days prior to the specified date closing the ballot.

Section 3. All ballots shall be signed and shall bear the full mailing address of the voting member. A majority of the members voting shall be required for the adoption of any amendment.

ARTICLE VIII--Disbandment

In the event of disbandment of the organization, the following nonprofit organizations shall become equal beneficiaries of the assets of the organization.

1. American Philatelic Research Library - a reserved fund for acquiring Sports and Olympic Philatelic Literature.

2. U.S. Olympic Committee - a reserved fund for acquiring additions or upgrading the Philatelic Collection held in the Olympic House (N.Y.).

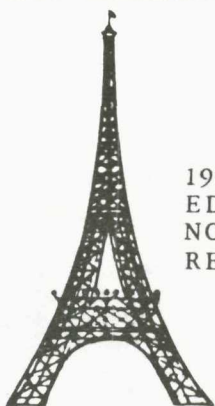

FILATELIA SPORT - OLIMPICA (Issue 12-13). Lead article deals with General George Patton, who competed in the 1912 Olympics in Stockholm in the pentathlon. He finished 5th overall. He would have finished first had it not been for his low score in pistol shooting, caused by his insistence in using his own pistol rather than a "Beretta" provided by the Olympic organizers.

Most of the rest of the publication is composed of very short articles, running a page to a page and a half, all beautifully illustrated with many reproductions of postmarks, postal stationery and meter cancels. Some tidbits gleaned. In Romania in 1982 there were 59 sports-related special postmarks and in 1983, 44. A cricket checklist is available from FILATELIA SPORT - OLIMPICA (Brivio Pierangelo, Via Tiziano 19, 20043 Arcore (MI), Italy) upon payment of costs for

photocopying and postage. Two books are reviewed. The first is "Volley e Bolli" by Mauro Gilardi, about volleyball and stamps, published by Edizioni Studio Erre, but other information on how to obtain it is not given. The other is a world catalog of cycling postmarks ("Catalogo Mondiale Annuli Speciali di Ciclismo") by Renato Bulfon, 120 pp., containing over 1,000 reproductions of postmarks. Available from the author at Via Mercato 6, 33050 Mortegliano (UD), Italy. Price not indicated.

One article illustrates postmarks, meter cancels and postal stationery dealing with the European Table Tennis championships from 1958 to 1984. Another illustrates similar material publicizing International Fencing Federation events. Japanese 1985 baseball-related postmarks are reproduced. There are four pages illustrating 1985 Italian sports-related postmarks. Recent stamps, postal stationery, postmarks and meter cancels on basketball, from many countries, are reproduced. Finally, a variety of meter cancels of the Olympics Museum at Olympia, Greece, for the period 1962 to 1972 is shown.

LETS POOL OUR OLYMPIC AND SPORTS KNOWLEDGE

Sports and Olympic philatelists have, collectively, a great deal of knowledge, which when pooled, can be of mutual benefit. Q- 106 Much has been written about the commercial role in the Los Angeles Olympic games and many sponsors used meter imprints to advertise their relationship to the 1984 Olympic games. Did IBM produce anything philatelic for the Los Angeles games last year?

Q- 107 I am aware that both a Olympic Village post card and envelope stationery were provided by the 1936 Berlin Organizing Committee for athletes use at the Doberitz Olympic Village. Was similar stationery produced for the 1936 female athletes who were housed in a dormitory on the Reichssportfeld?

A- 107 To my knowledge no separate stationery was provided for the female athletes. However, I have in my collection one of these 1936 Berlin Organizing Committee post cards, reproduced in this months Olympic Signatures column, which was overprinted on the message side above the "Olympisches Dorf, den" with the words "Frauenheim (Friesenhaus)". The message on the card written by Katherine T. Roche, one of the United States Medical Commissioners and nurse at the female dormitory reads, "Dear Margaret, I am having a most interesting time. Berlin is a very beautiful city. The games will, be over Sunday afternoon. We are sailing for home Wednesday, Aug. 19. Always my best..." It was canceled with the Berlin Olympia-Stadium "Bell" handstamp August 10, 1936.

As I do not know of another example of this item I presume that a very limited number of the Berlin Olympic Village cards were overprinted with the "Frauenheim (Friesenhaus)" text and might have been left at the desk in the female dormitory.

Although the Official 1936 Berlin Organizing Committee report discusses the post offices at the men's Doberitz Olympic Village there is no record, to my knowledge, of any postal facilities at the female dormitory. I therefore assume that after writing the card Miss Roche posted it from the stadium.

Your editor would be interested in any further information about this overprint. Does any reader have the overprint on another 1936 item?

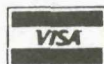
