



CANADA'S SPORTS STAMPS

Hockey 2, Others 81
That's the score after tallying the list of sports stamps issued in Canada.Considering the popularity of the game it's surprising that more than 30 years have passed since the appearance of the first Canadian stamp designed to commemorate hockey. On January 23, 1956, 30 million of the blue and white 5-cent value stamps \#359 were released. And, not only was this the first ice hockey stamp,it was the first Canadian stamp specifically issued to commemorate a sport.

The long wait for a second hockey stamp ended October 15, 1986 when a 34 -cent value hockey stamp was released by Canada Post to publicize the 1988 Winter Olympics in Calgary.

To the end of 1986,83 sports or sportsurelated stamps had been issued in Canada. Sixty of them portray or commemorate competitive sports, people or events. The rest show non-competitive recreational sports or sports - related items.

The first Canadian sport stamp \#158 was issued January 6, 1929 showing the Bluenose, launched as a swift fishing schooner in 1921. The Bluenose earned a reputation unequalled in Canadian maritime history, as a fisherman and as a racer in the Canadian-United States International Fisherman's Race. This 50-cent value stamp was reproduced on a 60-cent value stamp \#913 as part of set commemorating the International Philatelic Youth Foundation in Toronto in 1982.

By far the largest number of stamps issued for any sports event were the 35 relsased in connection with the 1976 Summer Olympic Games in Montreal. Running a distant second were the six stamps issued to commemorate the 1978 Commonwealth Games in Edmonton. However, three stamps were issued in 1986 to publicize the 1988 Winter Olympics, four have been announced for 1987 and several more are expected early in 1988 to tie in with the opening of the Games in Calgary.

## MOST COMMON

Although only two 1 ce hackey stamps have been issued, six other Canadian stamps display skaters or skates. The 1974, 8-cent Christmas stamp \#651 is a reproduction of a painting showing a group of skaters on an outdoor rink with three of the figures holding what appear to be hockey sticks. Skates and hockey equipment have long been popular Christmas gifts in Canada so it is appropriate that two other Christmas stamps relate to the winter sport.A skate is shown on the 1973 Christmas 6ecent stamp \#625, and a young skater wearing a numbered sweater appears on the 1975 6-cent \#675. The 20-cent, 1982 definitive stamp \#922 shows three antique skates while a pair of figure skaters are depicted on a 1972 8-cent stamp \#559 commemorating the World Figure Skating Championships held in Calgary. Young skaters are also featured on a 1974 8-cent Keep Fit, 1976 Olympic series stamp \#645.

In addition to the two Bluenose stamps, six others show sailboats. In fact, the first five Canadian sports stamps relate to sailing. The sixth was a hockey stamp, the first to commemorate a sport. Seven sports stamps show running in various forms including the first stamp \#472, ever issued to commemorate a major sports event held in Canada, the Fifth. Pan-American Games, in Winnipeg in 1967. Another running stamps is the Terry Fox Marathon of Hope commemorative stamp \#915 issued in 1982.

Three of the most popular spectator sports in Canada baseball (or softball), football and horse racing have never been shown on a Canadian stamp. Nor have golf or bowling ( 5 or 10 pin ) which, while not big spectator sports, involve hundreds of thousands participants across the counrty each year. Ironically, a lawn bowling stamp \#762 was issued in 1978 as part of a Commonwealth Games set. Low-interest sports such as lacrosse \#483, kayaking \#833 and field hockey \#834, have been depicted on stamps, the latter two commemorating world championships held in Canada.

## HIGHEST VALUES

Only five of Canada's sports stamps have carried face values of $\$ 1.00$ or more and four of these were issued for the 1976 summer Olympics. In March of 1975 the $\$ 1.00$ Sprinter \#656 and $\$ 2,00$ Plunger \#657 stamps were released showing sculptures of a runner and a swimmer, both in the starting position. These stamps were also intended to honor Canadian sculptor R. Tait McKenzie. One year later to the month, a $\$ 1,00$ stamp \#687 was issued showing Notre Dame Cathedral and Place Ville Marie, prominent Montreal landmarks, while a $\$ 2.00$ stamp \#688 displayed the Olympic stadium in Montreal.

On september 16, 1946, as one of the Peace Issce set a $\$ 1.00$ Train Ferry stamp was issued with a single sailboat shown in the foreground. This stamp carries the highest Scott 1987 Specialized Catalogue value of all Canadian sports stamps, $\$ 60.00$, mint very fine. However, a. miniature pane of eight $\$ 2.00$ Plunger stamps ondull paper catalogues at $\$ 120.00$, by far the highest price. for a catalogue-11sted sports item:

All 12 of Canada's semi-postal stamps were iasued for the 1976 Summer Games with the surcharge turned over to the organizing committee for the Games. Seven "back of the book" Officials employ stanps includej in the list of 83 Canadian sports stamps.

The first Canadian stainp, the 3d Beaver, was issued In 1851, but 78 years passed before the first sporis stamp, the Bluenose, appeared in 1929. The big years for sports stamps were 1974, 1975 and 1976, with thirteen issued in each jear, most of them relating to the Olymo1c Games, 1976.

MOST UNUSUAL, ATTRACTIVE
The most unusual sports stamps were the Keep Fit fourstamp summer and winter sets in March and September 1974. These stamps were the first in the world to use the laent image technique. On normal viewing a recreationsl sport can be seen, but when observed at an obliqua.angle the Montreal Olympics symbol will appear.

Selecting the "Most Attractive" Canadian sports stamp from the group of 83 is a personal matter, and while my heart is with the first ice hockey stamp, my choice is \#968, the 30-cent, 1982 stamp commemorating the looth Royal Canadian Henley Regatta in St. Catharines, Ontario. The stamp design captures the dramatic finish of the race of fours before the judge's tower on the spectator-ined Henley course.

A list of Canadian sports stamps accompanies this article. Indian, and Eskimo stamps show hunting, fishing and canoeing scenes are not listed as these are normal livilhood activities, not their recreational sports. Any errors or omissions are the responsibility of tive aithor.

## CHERRYSTONE AUCTION RESULTS DECEMBER, 1986

Cherrystone Auction Galleries, 132 West 34 th Street, New York, New York 10001 offers slick, well illustrated auction catalogs of world material. There is a good range of covers and proofs as well. Foreign material seems to be the strongest component and East European material is frequently well represented.

The sports and Olympic philatelist has to scan the catalogs for desired material and Cherrystone is not yet known to offer sports and Olympic material in an auction by itself.

A sampling of auction results presented below is based on the sale of December 3-4, 1986. The $10 \%$ buyer's premium is not included.

Some general comments may be in order. The Greek collection of 49 plate proofs averages out to $\$ 52$ per item (not including $10 \%$ buyer's commission). The photograph of one plate proof pair discloses no extending line from the design which is a characteristic of true proofs.

The Monaco items unsigned average out to $\$ 45$ each. The signed die proofs are higher at $\$ 60$ to $\$ 65$ each.

The single item commanding the largest bid was the Poland inverted center at $\$ 900$. I have seen the 1964 Russian Olympics green souvenir sheet regularly offfered in auctions and this suggests the item is not truly rare. Better Russian items seem to realize on the average $25 \%$ of Scott, but earlier never hinged sets do much better. The 1935 Spartacist Games never hinged set went for $39 \%$ of Scott. However, as a percentage of Scott catalog, the Austrian FIS never hinged sets went for $71 \%$ of catalog value. Why should the Russian 1935 set go for $39 \%$ of Scott and the Austrian sets of 1933-6 go for 71\%? In my opinion, this reflects demand more than supply. Also, a study of retail dealer price lists suggests that Scott regularly overprices Russian materials so that rather large retail discounts prevail - larger than for Austrian material of comparable periods.

## REVIEWS

"POSTAL MARKINGS OF UNITED STATES EXPOSITIONS" by William J. Bomar. 1986. 210 pages, $7 \times 10$ inches format. Glossy high quality book paper. Sewn binding. Available from David G. Phillips Publishing Co., Inc. P. O. Box 611388, North Miami, Florida 33161. Price Softbound book $\$ 25$ postpaid in U. S.; price hardbound $\$ 35$ postpaid in U. S.

This book has potential interest for specialists in the Olympic Games held at the Paris International Exposition in1900 and the St. Louis Exposition in 1904. Paris 1900 was the site of the Second Olympiad. St. Louis was the site of the Third Olympiad.

This book, together with David Wallechinsky's "The Complete Book of the Olympics" (Penguin Books, 1984), lays open before the Olympic philatelist the potential for fine philatelic specialization. By seeking postmarks with relevant Olympic dates, the Olympic philatelist can hope to fill the gap for two difficult Olympiads.

Bomar's book describes and illustrates eleven different U. S. Postal Station markings used at Paris 1900. There is a rubber money order branch handstamp and also a rectangular registry rubber handstamp. The Louisiana Purchase Exposition at St. Louis 1904 had no less than 18 different postmarks plus two sub-varieties. Bomar also describes other 1904 markings believed to exist but not known to him.

Bomar includes earliest day of use and last known day of use according to his experience of some 40 years in his specialty. Valuations are given for each listing. He has developed his own numbering system for the cancellations.

Mention is also made of postage stamps, postcards, advertising covers, seals and tickets. A rarity rating is given for seals by fair event but not for each seal. On a scale from 1 to 10 , 1900 and 1904 seals are rated a 3. 1 is the most common. There is a table of exposition vital statistics such as size, number of exhibitors, number of visitors and finances.

A very valuable discussion is presented of factors affecting prices for exposition markings. What factors detract or add to the value of an item and by how much? Four different types of illustrated covers have separate premiums. A discussion is briefly presented on the use of high value contemporary commemorative stamps on the covers. Much of this discussion is very useful in application to covers of other Olympiads. It should be noted that Bomar presents his opinion on the values for these numerous factors, not ironclad measuring sticks.

While only a few pages will have some direct value to the Olympic philatelist, nowhere else has such information been available. Recommended.

Catalog users now can add a new name to their philatelic numbering aystems. Robert J. DuBois has joined the illusm trious group of past Olympic vignette catalogers: Paul F. Kampacher ana Dick Green.

However, DuBois has gone much farther in extensively depicting the vast realm of material. Pages preceding the catalog listing give a historical background to the Olympic Games, a listing of the dates and venues of the modern Clympic Games, a detailed study of the Olympic. flag and the Olympic rings.

Here and there, DuBois adds to the romance and poignancy of the Olympic Games as envisaged by Olympic vignettes and pseudo-philatelic and pseudo-0lympic material. There are excerpts from Ernest Trory's "Philatelic History of the Olympic Games," which is now out of print. There are excerpts from programs and a most detailed explanation of the material from the Polish Prisoner of War Games of 1944. There is an incredible amount of material never illustrated before. The complex varieties for the 1936 Germany Olympics are illustrated and explained.

DuBois does not let the romantic ether obscure the careful scholarly detailed description of the material. Mindful that sometimes there can be weaknesses in reproduction, DuBois' listings are as thorough as Rampacher's were if not more so. Legends, sizes, shapes, perforations, color, methods of printing and gumming are all described here. Translations are an added plus. Much of the material is priced and I think most readers would find that there is a lot of affordable material out there - if you can find it.

Here and there are comments, evaluations and explanations that add much to the usefullness and clarity of this volume. Great expense went into making the black and white illustrations in best quality as possible. It has been a successful and worthwhile expense. While the price will seem formidable to label collectors used to collecting inexpensively, it will be eminently rewarded with knowledge, beauty and joy.

This reviewer had the pleasure of counseling and reviewing the development of this fine work. It is also a pleasure to recommend $1 t$.

OLYMPIC REVIEW
NOVEMBER-DECEMBER 1986

This issue has a number of features that may be of particular interest to sport and Olympic enthusiasts. The 91st Session of the International Olympic Committee was held at Lausanne, Switzerland as a full report is presented. The Games of the XXVth Olympiad was given to Barcelona and the XVth Olympic Winter Games was given to Albertville, France.

President Samaranch presented awards to the winners of the "Prix Olympia" competition for the most beautiful Olympic stamps for the 1984 Olympic Games. Directors of the postal administrations of Poland, France and West Germany came to receive their prizes for first, second and third place, respectively.

The IOC voted to hold the Olympic Winter Games halfway through the Olympiad, in four-year cycles, rather than in the same year as the summer Games. The decision will become effective after 1992. Thus the XVIIth Olympic Winter Games will be held in 1994. This will make the task of the National Olympic Committees easier in arranging time and financial commitments.

Three new National Olympic Committees were approved.
They are Aruba, Cook Islands and Guam. Thus, philatelic purists may need to reconsider the acceptability of these countries into their collections, if applicable.

Baseball will be on the Olympic program starting 1992 with competition limited to six teams only.

Olympic House was inaupurated at this session and there is a color photo graph of a stunning fresco portraying the theme or Olympism by Swiss artists Hans Erni. This should make a very popular picture postcard.

There are several detailed and illustrated pages describing the chosen cities for the 1992 Olympic Games. The Olympic Cup created by Baron de Coubertin in 1906 went to the city of Stuttgart, West Germany for 1986 for hosting so well the VIth European Athletics Championships last August. There is news on progress at Seoul and Calgary, hosts of the 1988 Olympics. Canada is sponsoring a series of ten sterling silver Olympic coins. They will be distributed every six months until the opening of the Games in 1988.

An article on Sports and the Arts features Salvador Dali, the surrealistic artist. He has done pictorial works featuring baseball, bicycling, equestrian themes, soccer, swimmers. In 1959, Dali painted one of the 23 official postcards for the Tour de France. Perhaps some country might show Dali's work for a future Olympic issue.

The Xth Asian Games at Seoul is described.
Finally, there is a supplement to the Olympic Review September 1986. It is the Olympic Encyclopedia issue devoted to Table Tennis. This separate issue of $40+$ pages described the history of table tennis, the administration of the International Table Tennis Federation and a description of the competitions along with a rules summary. This issue should be very useful to table tennis philatelists. The dates. sites, and accomplishments of the ITTF Congresses from 1926 through 1985 are listed.

There is announcement that future issues of the Olympic Encyclopedia will cover handball, equestrian sports and fencing.

The Olympic Encyclopedia supplements are separately priced at SF 10.00 but are otherwise free of charge to subscribes to the Olympic Review. A subscription to the Olympic Review costs SF 60.00 per annum. # ETH WORLD HOCKEY CUP FOR MEN

1986 was the centenary year of Britain's Hockey Assoctation, and an appropriate year for Britain to host the World Cup, at London's Willesden Stadium. Great Britain's bronze medal in the Los Angeles Olympics had led to a resurgence of interest in hockey, such that there was widespread interest in the World Cup, very good attendances, and, unusual for a 'minority' sport, regular television coverage. That Britain only secured the silver medal was a disappointment, though Australia's gold was well deserved, and the British team have naturally set their sights on gold in Seoul.

The 34 p . stamp was issued on 15 July as the top valu. the sports set generally described in the article on the Commonwealth 6225.34 p . was the airmail rate to Australasia etc, and reported cylinder nuaver's are:

The stamp design was reproduced on a PHQ card, and there were two postmarks:

727 6TH Vorld Hockey Cup for Men 1986. Hational Hockey Centre Villesden Stadium London EV10 15 July 1986. This marked the first day of issue of the stamp.

741 6TH Vorld Hockey Cup 1986 London Villesden EV10. This was in use throughout the tournament from 4-19 October, and there was a special posting box at the stadium.
