CRICKET RIVALRY AND PHILATELY

THE "ASHES"

The most famous rivalry in cricket is that between England and Australia.

The game was brought to Australia by the British military and traders in the late eighteenth century. By the middle of the nineteenth century, the sport was well-established and English teams were touring on a regular basis.

In 1877, the first International or Test Match was played between the best players of England and Australia at the Melbourne Cricket Club.

In 1977, Australia celebrated the centenary of this match by issuing a se-tenant strip of five stamps showing a period panorama cricket scene. This theme was continued in the postmark and cachet. (Fig. 1) The Australian tour of England in 1977 continued the centenary celebration. Each Test Match produced its own distinctive cancellation showing cricketers in action. (Fig. 2)



The first ever Test Match in England against the touring Australians was at the Oval in September, 1880. England won by five wickets and was captained by Dr. W. G. Grace.

In 1980, England issued a stamp to celebrate the centenary of this match featuring a batsman playing an off-drive. Figure 3 shows the stamp with cachet and special "Cricket Ball" postmark. A centenary Test Match was played at Lord's. (Fig. 4)



On 29 August 1882, England lost to the Australian tourists for the first time at home. The London Sporting Times published its famous mock obituary which gave rise to the expression the "Ashes".

In the next tour to Australia, the English captain, the Hon. Ivor Bligh, was presented with the ashes of a bail in

a small pottery urn. A red velvet bag was made to contain the urn. The ashes and urn in the velvet bag are on display in the Cricket Memorial Gallery at Lord's. The urn never changes hands and only metaphorically goes to the Australians when that country wins the Test Series against England.

In 1982, both the English and Australian post offices produced special covers to celebrate the hundredth anniversary of this game. The cachet of the English cover (Fig. 5) shows the pottery urn between the lion and the kangaroo representing England and Australia respectively. The indicium of the Australian cover (Fig. 6) also shows the pottery urn and a reproduction of the London Sporting Times obituary.





The Ashes Test Series of 1985, sponsored by the Cornhill Insurance Co., produced a series of special cacheted covers for the six Tests each identical except for the addition of a postmark at the actual Test site. Figure 7 shows the one from Lord's. England won the series 3-1 with 2 drawn and regained the "Ashes".

The most recent contest was when England toured Australia in 1986-7. Billed as the "Clashes For The Ashes", England won the series 2-1 with 2 drawn and thus retained the "Ashes". Figure 8 shows the special cover produced for the series; the cachet shows the velvet bag and urn. The cancellation shows a wicket, and the "Gabba" is the nickname for the Woolloongabba Ground, headquarters of the Queenland's Cricket Association Ground in Brisbane.

The bicentennial of the Marylebone Cricket Club (MCC) is celebrated this year. Although no stamps were issued, the British Post Office produced four booklets featuring scenes from the Lord's Ground. The second of these shows the velvet bag and pottery urn. (Fig. 9)

A - 115 Many thanks to Robert J. Du Bois and Sherwin Podolsky who responded to information about the Olympic Philatelic Exhibition held on the occasion of the XVI Olympiad, Melbourne.

The catalog of "OLYMPEX 1956" states that the Olympic Philatelic Exhibition, organized by the Victorian Philatelic Association, was held in the show rooms of Preston Motors Pty. Ltd., 109 Russell Street, Melbourne November 12 to 24,1956 from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily except sundays. The display was non-competitive.

Special souvenir covers are known to exist with commemorative postmarks. During the opening of the exhibition a red-inked 12 Nov.,1956 postmark featuring a torch bearer running to the left is encircled by the text, "Olympic Philatelic Exhibition/Melbourne, Australia". On subsequent days black ink was applied to the same illustrative motif with the torch bearing athlete running in the opposite direction.

In addition to the above commemorative postmarks a special Olympex registration label with the text, "R/Olympex/Melbourne Olympic/Philatelic Exhibition / No. "was provided for registered mail posted from the exhibition.

Although not philatelic, two different style advertising labels, featuring a sprinting athlete, with information about the location and dates of OLYMPEX 1956" were also produced to publicize the exhibit. Such labels tied to covers by cancelations are rare.



1987 U.S. Basketball Cancels by Norman Rushefsky

Once again the Hutchinson, Kansas Post Office provided a machine cancellation for the National Junior College Athletic Association Basketball Championship held in March. A cover with this cancellation is Illustrated in Figure 1.

Later in March the National Collegiate Athletic Association's championship series was held in New Orleans. The final game between Indiana University coached by Bobby Knight and Syracuse University coached by Jim Boeheim was truly memorable. A last second off-balance jump-shot scuttled the Orangemen from Syracuse. The attractive cancel Illustrated in Figure 2 features a steamboat, a trumpet and a basketball.



In August the Pan American Games were held in Indianapolis, Indiana and various cancels were available at the postal stations adjacent the facilities at which the events were held. The basketball station cancel is shown in Figure 3.

In September the New Richmond, Indiana post office provided a special hand cancellation honoring the annual Hickory Festival. This cancel features a hickory nut dribbling a basketball and notes the movie "Hoosiers." This movie was filmed in New Richmond and is about a small-town Indiana high school basketball team which wins the state championship. The cancellation is shown in Figure 4.



OLYMPICS, BASEBALL AND TENNIS LEAD POPULARITY

By Clem Reiss

A review of the collecting interests of Sports Philatelists International members shows few changes in interest in the past six years. Olympics still leads all other categories buy a wide margin. Baseball and tennis have passed up soccer to become the second and third most collected sports categories. Of the top 15 topics, Yachting is the only sport to be added to the list in the last six years. BICYCLE STAMPS

The third issue of "Bicycle Stamps" is dated Autumn, 1987. It comprises 64 pages, reproduced by photocopy, in 9 1/2" x 11 3/4" format. It contains a number of short articles and reproductions of philatelic and related material, with comments and annotations, all pertaining to the bicycle (as well as the tricycle and unicycle). "Bicycle Stamps," which is issued semi-annually, is the official publication of the Bicycle Stamps Club, which has affiliated with the British Thematic Association and is in the process of re-establishing its affiliation with the American Topical Association.

The present issue of the publication features a 22 page illustrated checklist of 1984 bicycle-related philatelic material — stamps, postal stationery, post office postcards, local stamps, booklets, etc. New issues of bicycle-related stamps and postal stationery for 1986 and 1987 are also illustrated and described. Three pages are devoted to illustrations of cinderella items — cigarette cards on the bicycle theme. There are also a number of illustrations of newly discovered bicycle connections on some philatelic items — a keen-eyed collector having found a bicycle in the distant background of a stamp, for example.

The Bicycle Stamps Club is for all topical collectors of bicycle-related philatelic material. The interests of some members extend to all aspects of the bicycle, not merely those which are sports-related, and "Bicycle Stamps" reflects this broader interest. However, collectors interested only in the bicycle as it relates to sports will find the club and its publication invaluable. Annual membership in the organization costs \$16.00. THE GAMES OF THE SMALL STATES OF EUROPE

The Games were held for the first time in the Republic of San Marino from May 23rd to May 26th 1985. The participating countries were: Andorra, Cyprus, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Malta, Monaco, and San Marino. Albania and the Vatican City were invited but did not send teams. The Games are scheduled to be held every two years.

The sporting events were: Athletics (Track & Field), Basketball, Cycling, Judo, Swimming, Shooting (pistol), Skeet and Weightlifting.

San Marino issued several philatelic items in honor of the Games, among which were five stamps (fig.1), issued May 16, 1985. These represented Swimming (50 1.), Athletics (350 1.), Shooting (400 1.), Cycling (450 1.) and Basketball (600 1.). The 400 lira stamp was also used in a 10 stamp booklet (fig. 2).







There were also three meter cancels used; The "A" meter was used before the Games began and a similar meter "B" used during the Games. The third meter was used at the Sport Stamp Exhibition, "SPORTPHILEX '85, held in conjunction with the Games. (fig. 4)

Four Post Offices were used, one at SPORTPHILEX '85, another the Stadium in Serraville and two mobile post offices, #1 at the Skeet Shooting venue, and #2 was assigned to cover Cycling and Swimming. All four post offices used a special label for registered letters. (fig.5). Finally, there were five cards offered which reproduced the five stamps and two special cards commemorating the Games. Two different envelopes were used by the Organizing Committee.

The Second Games of the Small States of Europe were held in Monaco from May 14 - May 17 1987. The same countries attended and participated in the same events.

The philatelic items included a set of two stamps that were issued April 23, 1987. The 3fr. illustrated Tennis and the 5 fr. Windsurfing. There was a special First Day cancel April 23rd, and a "flamme". (fig.6).

San Marino publicized the 2nd Games with the use of a special meter of the San Marino National Olympic Commitee.(fig. ?).

1936 ADVERTISING OLYMPIC COVERS

Figures 1 and 2 show both sides of a cover from El Salvador posted February 28, 1936. The cover is bluish and airmail weight paper. It bears the imprint of the well-known red oval publicity vignette. Across the bottom the vignette imprint is lightly tied by a lined roller cancellation that extends across the lower part of the cover.

The stamps are cancelled by an undated pictorial rectangular cancel. The box portion at left which reads: CORREO AEREO/SAN SALVADOR/picture of biplane/EL SALVADOR C.A. The right portion of the rectangular cancel consists of eight slightly wavy lines.

The circular cancel reads: CORREO AEREO/SERVICIO INTERNA-CIONAL/date/SAN SALVADOR/EL SALVADOR C.A.. Both cancel types are in blue. However, the roller impression along the bottom is black.

The reverse side has the arrival machine cancel of Cristobal, Canal Zone. Because this cancel is black, I believe the roller impression on front was applied in that country.

The "CORREO AEREO-AIRMAIL" imprint on front is in red. The addresses on front and back are in black.

The cover appears commercial between two offices of a steamship line.

The stamps include the 1 colon black issue for the Third Central American Games in 1935. It is overprinted HABILTADO which means "rehabilitated." I believe this means that the unoverprinted original issue became invalid after a date and the remainders were overprinted to make them valid again.

The red vignette at lower left is deeper in color than on the original labels because the printing is on the bluish tinted envelope paper.

I have seen one other similar cover postmarked 25 Feb 1936. Different stamps are used totaling only only 53 centavos. However, the cover illustrated for this article bears 1.90 colones postage. I wonder why there is such a difference Neither cover shows wear differences to suggest that the cover with greater postage carried greater weight. Can any reader explain the difference?



These covers make a welcome addition to a collection of 1936 Olympics because they are a contribution from a country outside the host country. Thematically, I telieve these covers would fit under a publicity or promotion category.

I do not recall any similar situations where a design found on Olympic labels was printed on envelopes for publicity.

I would like to believe that El Salvador was a participant in the Olympic Games at Berlin and that her athletes traveled German line. Can any reader confirm this?

Eas any reader seen this kind of cover before? Do similar covers exist used by Lloyd steamship offices in other countries?


USSR BASEBALL POWER ???

The illustrated cachet on the left side shows a batter winging a bat. Surrounding the area are a variety of items. It is not clear to me what these items represent. The caption on the cachet translates: Gorodky Igra Narodnaja (Gorodky National Game).
