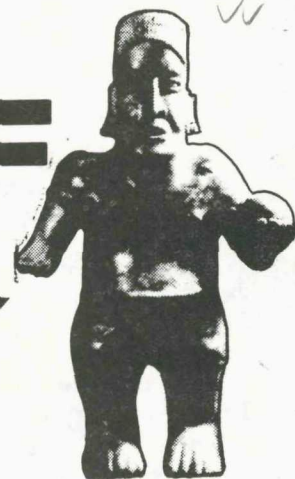




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Who needs the Olympics?

When the Olympic Games were foolishly revived in 1896 after a merciful 15-century lapse, American athletes arrived in Athens 11 days late. They had not been told that the Greeks were still using the Julian calendar. This year, too, the games are off to stumbling starts.

"Operation Snow Lift" is under way in Innsbruck, Austria, where the winter games begin Feb. 4. There has been no substantial snow-fall since November and snow is being trucked in. And Montreal says facilities for the summer games may not be ready by July 17, opening day.

The winter games mock the Olympic myth about the universality of the games - all nations competing as brothers and sisters, etc. Winter events - skiing, the luge (tobogganing, sort of) - are strange to many nations. Imagine assembling an Angolan luge team. No wonder only 14 nations have won medals in Winter Olympics.

(The wisest recent decision by American voters was by Coloradans who repudiated the politicians' invitation to host the winter Olympics thereby preventing incalculable damage to Colorado's solvency and ecology).

Summer games are worse because they are larger. They are a burden to the host country's taxpayers, and they are a net loss to international good will.

The 1972 Munich Olympics cost \$657 million, but Germans were willing to pay to erase the memory of the 1936 games, a Hitler propaganda festival. And they believed Olympic facilities would be money-makers for years. The facilities are not making money, and the games are remembered for the massacre of 11 Israeli athletes.

OTHER MUNICH memories include the exclusion of an integrated Rhodesian team to satisfy various nations, most of them dictatorships; officials setting back the game clock, which had expired, to enable the Soviet basketball team to beat the United States team; a United States rifleman's score being electronically verified for a gold medal, but the medal going to the runner-up, a North Korean who complained about the verifying machine; several nations joining the United States in protesting - in vain - the ludicrously low scores given an American diver by a Russian and two East German judges; and an Italian judge who gave top scores to all Italian divers.

There are many similar Munich memories, but let's hurry to Mon-

treau, where politicians told their constituents that the Olympics would cost \$130 million - or \$300 million, tops. The final price will be about \$1 billion, leaving Montreal with interesting debts and white elephants disguised as facilities, athletic and otherwise. The elephants will be gathering dust when the 1980 games open in Moscow's Lenin Stadium before 103,000 proletarians cheering the Soviet Union's full-time, state-supported "amateurs."

There are only two kinds of motives - political and commercial - strong enough to sustain this quadrennial farce. Montreal politicians are like most municipal politicians, only perhaps more so. They will fight to their constituents' last dollar for a publicity bonanza.

Brezhnev, like Hitler, understands the propaganda value of having the world's television cameras tightly focused on games, without a glance at the Gulag. And medals won by Communist bloc athletes are hailed in the East German "newspapers" as proof that socialism, like Wonderbread, builds strong bodies nine ways.

Anyway, Olympics are boons to many businesses-hotels, airlines, trinket-makers, and especially television. ABC has paid more than \$40 million for the right to broadcast this year's festivities, which should be the usual feats of international comity, to wit:

In 1900, United States athletes protested the sacrilege of Sunday competition.

In 1908, in London, Finns refused to march behind the Russian flag. Americans refused to dip the flag to King Edward VII and protested most things British, including the boots British wore in the tug-of-war.

In 1912 Finns again squabbled with Russians, Italians fought with French.

In 1920, at Antwerp, a Belgian crowd went berserk when the British won at water polo.

That, of course, was nothing compared to the Soviet-Hungarian water polo war in 1956, when the water ran red with blood.

Olympics are like the United Nations: They often replicate, and sometimes, magnify, the unpleasantness in the world. That is one reason why both are mistakes.

The ancient Olympics degenerated into commercial, corrupt, and riotous carnivals until, in 394 A.D., they were stopped by the Roman Emperor Theodosius. A sound fellow, Theodosius; he deserved a gold medal for judgment.

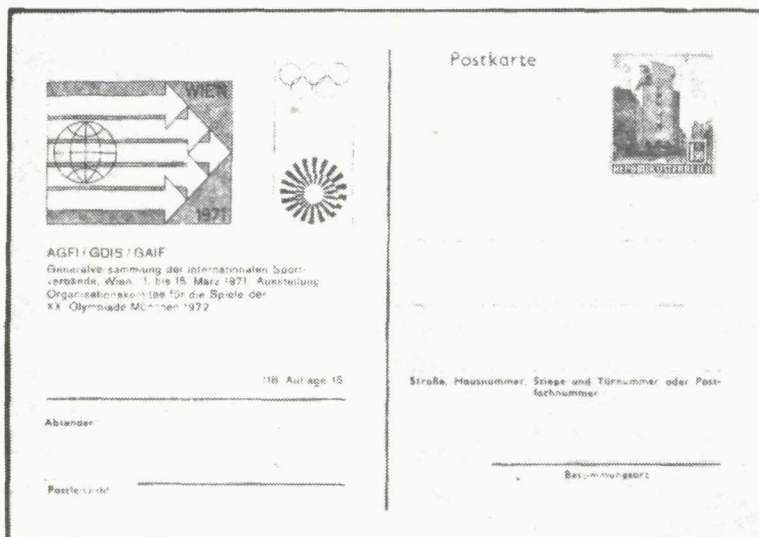

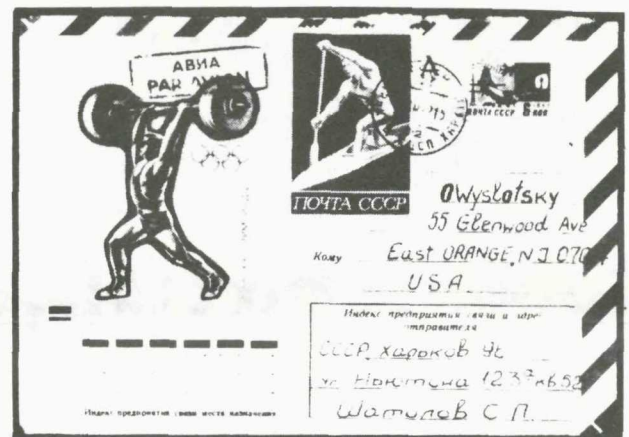

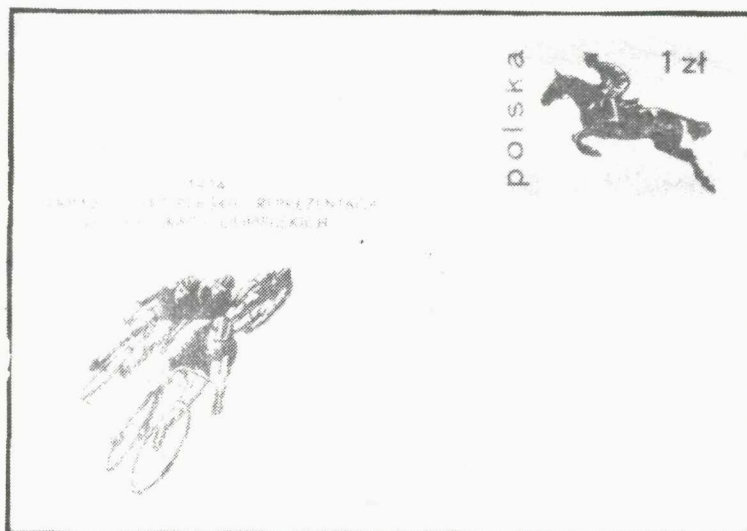

We wonder if any of you SPI members have ever given thought as to what would happen to our hobby and the SPI if the Olympic Games were not held any longer?? And if you think I am trying to scare you in any form; just take the time to read the very thought provoking article by the well-known writer Mr. George F. Will entitled; "Who Needs the Olympics?", on page one of this issue.

Basically in his article, Mr. Will is trying to show how the Olympic Games have degenerated into a political, commercial and almost corrupt carnivals. Admit it, he is very well on the right track. I shudder to think what would happen to the stamp dealers; the album and mount manufacturers; the catalogue printers; all those foreign governments who use the games for the Olympic "stamp" issues to gig the collectors...and not to mention what it would do to the hotel and motel business and the transportation business. Think about this if you will.

Guess you SPI members would have to look to other fields of stamp collecting and perhaps abandon your favorite sport or theme or what have you. We also wonder how the American Topical Association who has many sports and Olympic members, would manage this situation if it did occur.

Even the souvenir manufacturers would suffer if there were no games. Almost all businesses would feel some part of this impact. BUT the collector would suffer the most; as he would lose his favorite hobby which gives him so many hours of pleasure and relaxation. And just think how the cost of the Olympic issues would sky-rocket if this did happen. I can well visualize how some of the wall paper issues and covers would suddenly be worth say \$25 instead of the \$1.00 or so they now *should* bring.

Can you see the mad scramble and profit making amongst the dealers? The advertising business would sure boom for a while and we can just visualize what some of the ads would read.

While I have only scratched the surface of what could happen to our hobby if this did happen; we hope we have awakened in each of you, the desire to think about your Olympic Committee and their doings---it would be a wonderful thing if all of you SPI members not only wrote to the US Olympic Committee and expressed your views on this, but also would write to the President's Commission on Olympic Sports and air your views with them.

I will gladly furnish names and addresses as to where to air your views on the Olympics and Philately. Please enclose a properly stamped and self-addressed envelope with your inquiry.

TOPICAL SEALS RELEASED BY THE A.T.A.

Fifty-nine popular topical subjects, each adapted from actual stamp designs of 20 countries appear in vivid multi-color on sheets of philatelic seals produced by the American Topical Association.

The 5 x 8 inch sheet contains 40 seals each 1 inch square with color ATA coat of arms (globe & lamp of knowledge) arranged in checkerboard pattern interspersed with seals picturing in 6 to 8 colors, 20 major topics and 39 sub-topics: animals (horse) space (rocket, astronomy, communications); Americana (flag, statue of liberty); sports (soccer, Olympics); ships (sailing ship); art (painting, nude, da Vinci); medicine (reptile, symbol); flowers (rose); railways (steam locomotive); religion (Madonna & Child, Christmas); music (notation, composer instrument); Scouts (symbol, jamboree encampment); marine life (fish, coral, sea shell); United Nations worldwide (bird-dove, UN emblem); insects (butterfly); stamps on stamps (Churchill, Mason, tools of philately-magnifying glass, tongs); maps (polar, antarctic); Europa (birds); geology (mineral); aviation (Concorde, balloon, UPU)

The twenty countries whose stamp designs provided sources for seal designs are: Poland, New Zealand, Japan, Uruguay, Portugal, Denmark, United Nations, Australia, Bulgaria, Germany (West), Congo, Sweden, Korea, Israel, Cuba, Canada, Mexico, Great Britain, United States, France.

I do hope that these changes meet with the approval of the general membership and constructive criticism is invited by writing to your President-Editor.

With this issue we are mailing out the new permanent membership cards. A replacement card will cost you \$1.00 so please do not lose your card.

Lately I have been perusing the buying ads for used U.S. commems and have noticed an oddity. It seems that the buying prices for used se-tenant commems is anywhere from three to ten times the price of a single issue commem.

It has been my observation that there has been a lack of use of se-tenant commems by philatelists. Fully 50% of my philately mail is franked with regular stamps!

This year is a banner year for se-tenant issues in the U.S. and the only way to have adequate supplies of used stamps for the future is for philatelists to buy several sheets of se-tenants and use them on their mail to other philatelists.

The 50 State Flag issue is a case in point. I have used up four sheets of these stamps but have only seen about 20 or so on my mail.

At the time of this writing, production of the 1932 Olympic hand-is under way. Please contact me about any errors, omissions and comments. They will be a basis for future updating in JSP until a supplement or revision can be contemplated.

Bill Brown has some interesting information on the 1936 Olympics including the picture postcards and Zeppelin flights. Readers wishing to add their information about these areas to what Bill has, should send it with xeroxes to him.

Joe Schirmer is off and running in his study on the 1940 Olympics. The only relevant stamp issue seems to be Haiti's semi postals but essays reportedly exist for Finland and covers are known with commemorative cachets and meters. Who can provide xeroxes and other information on this and other material for 1940 to Joe? Please write him direct.

I am accumulating material on Olympiads from 1896 through 1928. The field is too vast and I would like to share one or more of the Olympiads of this period with someone who will seriously pursue sources of information. I will gladly assist to enable followthrough.

One interesting area often overlooked are messages relevant to Olympics on letters inside covers and on postcards. Readers should be able recognize the root term "OLYMP" in foreign language messages. Photocopies of both cover or card and message side should be sent to the respective study leader who will arrange translation.

A comprehensive listing of color trials, essays and proofs of the 1906 Olympics is long overdue. P. J. Drossos of Athens has advised that this information was destroyed in the postal archives during World War II. So, we must rely on ourselves and others interested to accumulate this information.

An important part of any study is securing photographs or high-quality half-tones of items selected for eventual printing and publishing. Xerox photocopies are seldom suitable. When the time comes that you are asked to furnish items or the original material to John La Porta or other SPI-designated person who will arrange to do the photography without charge, we hope we have your cooperation. If this is not possible, please accordingly and we will work around the problem.

If you are contemplating disposing of your Olympic collection, consider making photocopies of it available to the study leader. The main interest is not in the basic Scott-listed stamps, but in the varieties and postal history. Once your material is gone, the opportunity for inclusion in studies may be permanently lost. Furthermore, consider giving other SPI members an opportunity to acquire your material first. An auction service is available through Olech Wyslowsky. Also the JSP Members Bourse classified ad rate at 2¢ a is unbeatable. IMOS, the European counterpart of SPI, has about half the membership and usually 8 to 15 members ads per issue.

Check the listing of officers on page 4 in this issue for addresses of the study leaders mentioned in this article. Let's hear from you soon.

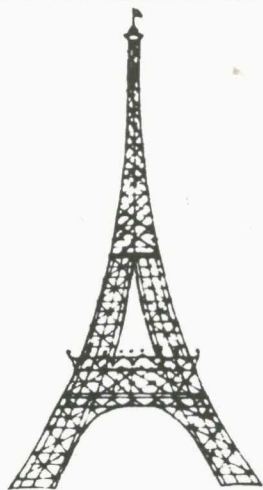

A-30 Your editor has in his collection a Bolivian stamp that was overprinted in gold ink, with five Olympic rings and the Tokyo symbol. To commemorate the 18th Olympiad someone overprinted the remainders of the July 2, 1962 issue picturing flowers. The specimen that is in your editor's collection is of the St James Lily 600 value. However, the stamp was never officially issued. In fact, the Gibbons, Scott and Minkus catalogs lists no stamps issued from Dec. 21, 1963 to Aug. 21, 1966. Your editor has been informed that the reason for this is that the Bolivian post offices had such a backlog of stamps that they discontinued the issuance of new issues. Many questions still remain about these overprinted stamps. Who overprinted them? The Bolivian government or a private individual? Were all of the designs of the 1962 issue overprinted? How many sheets were overprinted? Additional information, from members, is invited.

A-31 Carl-Olof Enhagen's book "SportStamps" informs us that "The Sport of 'Buzcashi' dates back to the Mogol invasion in the thirteenth century. 'Buzcashi' is an equestrian sport in which two teams of from 100 to 300 horsemen fight each other to get a buckskin. The ground is a large flat, sandy field about two miles long. In the middle of the ground there is a hole in which a stuffed buckskin, weighing up to 35 lbs., is placed. Around this skin the horsemen are grouped in a circle, and on a signal from the referee the horsemen rush to the hole to seize the buckskin. The two teams fight each other wildly to get the skin, riding at breakneck speed across the ground. The player who succeeds in getting the buckskin back in the hole scores one point for his team."

Q-35 Is it true that Cecilia College was the youngest Olympic competitor? If so, could anyone provide background information about her? How old was she when she first competed in the 1932 Lake Placid Olympic Games? Where did she place in the finals?
